Happy Labor Day! As you can see from the overview report, August was tough. We had an income of \$19,652. but expenses of \$33,130. Overall, our expenses, year to date, exceed our income by \$12,199. Hopefully the summer doldrums are over, and our attendance will pick back up. The good news is we haven't had any large expenses this month. We do still have 3 air conditioner units on backorder for classrooms (just over \$3,900. Per unit). Stay cool during this heat wave.

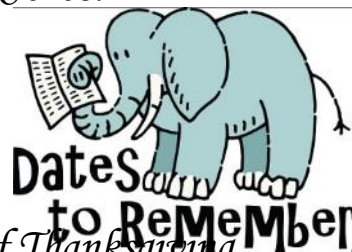

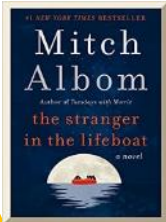
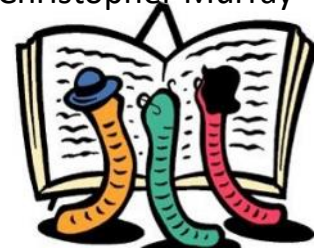

WEDNESDAY EVENING BIBLE STUDY STARTS SEPTEMBER 21 @ 6:30PM

Isaiah was human just like us, and yet he radically trusted God and called anyone who would listen to do the same. His message highlights freedom from captivity and light breaking through darkness for those who would heed his words. Anyone in need of a little freedom and light in their thoughts, attitudes, or actions? Hanging out with Isaiah over the seven sessions will be like filling a trust prescription with amazing side effects of hope and peace in your life! Unpacking Isaiah's words will reveal that we can trust God more than our own human effort or the counterfeits the world suggests.



There is so much to study in Isaiah. It has been referred to as "a Bible in miniature." The book's sixty-six chapters and the Bible's sixty-six books include all genres of biblical literature, such as historical narrative, poetry, and prophecy. Some have compared Isaiah's first thirty-nine chapters with the thirty-nine books of the Old Testament because of the emphasis on God's judgment toward sin, while the last twenty-seven chapters parallel the New Testament's focus on God's grace.

There is a lot to unpack in this study. There are 7-weeks of study. We can take a break when we start to get overwhelmed. We will walk through this together, leaving no one behind; and finish by Thanksgiving.



Join us **Wednesday, September 21 at 6:30 pm in the Community Center** as we begin our study. Books are available from the usual sources, such as Christian Book, LifeWay and Amazon. The books are just a bit more expensive than we are used to. But they now include access to all the video lessons on-line through LifeWay. We will watch the videos each week and have group discussion as usual. If you need to miss a week, you can always keep up by watching the video on your own.

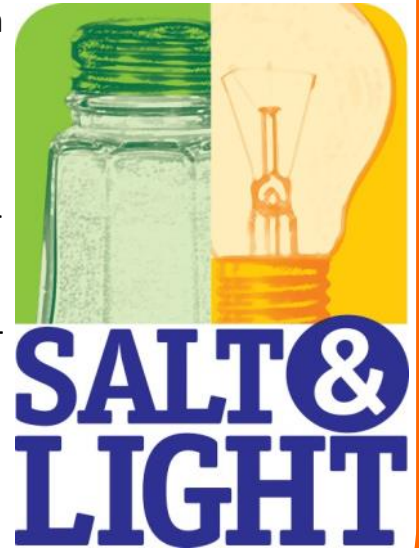
Sunday Salt & Light

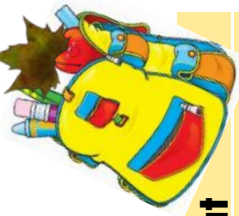


A Big 'Thank You'
