Amos 7:7-15

⁷This is what he showed me: the Lord was standing beside a wall built with a plumb line, with a plumb line in his hand. ⁸ And the LORD said to me, "Amos, what

do you see?" And I said, "A plumb line." Then the Lord said,
"See, I am setting a plumb line
in the midst of my people Israel;
I will spare them no longer;

9 the high places of Isaac shall be made desolate,
and the sanctuaries of Israel shall be laid waste,
and I will rise against the house of Jeroboam with the sword."

Amaziah Complains to the King

¹⁰ Then Amaziah, the priest of Bethel, sent to King Jeroboam of Israel, saying, "Amos has conspired against you in the very center of the house of Israel; the land is not able to bear all his words. ¹¹ For thus Amos has said, 'Jeroboam shall die by the sword, and Israel must go into exile away from his land.'"

¹² And Amaziah said to Amos, "O seer, go, flee away to the land of Judah, earn your bread there, and prophesy there, ¹³ but never again prophesy at Bethel, for it is the king's sanctuary, and it is a temple of the kingdom."

¹⁴Then Amos answered Amaziah, "I am^[a] no prophet nor a prophet's son, but I am^[b] a herdsman and a dresser of sycamore trees, ¹⁵ and the LORD took me from following the flock, and the LORD said to me, 'Go, prophesy to my people Israel.'

SECOND LESSON

Ephesians 1:3-14

Spiritual Blessings in Christ

³ Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places, ^{[a] 4} just as he chose us in Christ^[b] before the foundation of the world to be holy and blameless before him in love. ⁵ He destined us^[c] for adoption as his children^[d] through Jesus Christ, according to the good pleasure of his will, ⁶ to the praise of his glorious grace that he freely bestowed on us in the Beloved. ⁷ In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of his grace ⁸ that

he lavished on us. With all wisdom and insight ⁹ he has made known to us the mystery of his will, according to his good pleasure that he set forth in Christ, ¹⁰ as a plan for the fullness of time, to gather up all things in him, things in heaven and things on earth. ¹¹ In Christ we have also obtained an inheritance, ^[e] having been destined according to the purpose of him who accomplishes all things according to his counsel and will, ¹² so that we, who were the first to set our hope on Christ, might live for the praise of his glory. ¹³ In him you also, when you had heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and had believed in him, were marked with the seal of the promised Holy Spirit; ¹⁴ this^[f] is the pledge of our inheritance toward redemption as God's own people, to the praise of his glory.

GOSPEL

Mark 6:14-29

The Death of John the Baptist

¹⁴ King Herod heard of it, for Jesus's^[a] name had become known. Some were^[b] saying, "John the baptizer has been raised from the dead, and for this reason these powers are at work in him." ¹⁵ But others said, "It is Elijah." And others said, "It is a prophet, like one of the prophets of old." ¹⁶ But when Herod heard of it, he said, "John, whom I beheaded, has been raised."

¹⁷ For Herod himself had sent men who arrested John, bound him, and put him in prison on account of Herodias, his brother Philip's wife, because Herod^[c] had married her. ¹⁸ For John had been telling Herod, "It is not lawful for you to have your brother's wife." ¹⁹ And Herodias had a grudge against him and wanted to kill him. But she could not, ²⁰ for Herod feared John, knowing that he was a righteous and holy man, and he protected him. When he heard him, he was greatly perplexed, ^[d] and yet he liked to listen to him. ²¹ But an opportunity came when Herod on his birthday gave a banquet for his courtiers and officers and for the leaders of Galilee. ²² When his daughter Herodias^[e] came in and danced, she pleased Herod and his guests, and the king said to the girl, "Ask me for whatever you wish, and I will give it." ²³ And he swore^[f] to her, "Whatever you ask me, I will give you, even half of my kingdom." ²⁴ She went out and said to her mother,

"What should I ask for?" She replied, "The head of John the baptizer." ²⁵ Immediately she rushed back to the king and requested, "I want you to give me at once the head of John the Baptist on a platter." ²⁶ The king was deeply grieved, yet out of regard for his oaths and for the guests, he did not want to refuse her. ²⁷ Immediately the king sent a soldier of the guard with orders to bring John's^[g] head. He went and beheaded him in the prison, ²⁸ brought his head on a platter, and gave it to the girl. Then the girl gave it to her mother. ²⁹ When his disciples heard about it, they came and took his body and laid it in a tomb.

In Jesus' day, another prophet, John the Baptist, also gave the king a harsh message. He admonished the king for his conduct in marriage, and the king was deceived by his sin to bring about the death of John. Both Amos and John proclaimed the truth and suffered for it. But God's word was true and had consequences. *Lord in your mercy...*

We pray for our nation, state and city; our president, governor, mayor and the leaders of the world. Lord, how many times does our sin deceive <u>us</u> and cause us to be disobedient to God? But God is merciful and forgives our sins when we repent. In Ephesians Saint Paul says, "In [Jesus Christ] we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of sins, in accordance with the riches of God's grace ⁸ that he lavished on us." Yes, we can turn our lives around because of God's grace. Paul continues, "[God] made known to us the mystery of his will according to his good pleasure, which he purposed in Christ, ¹⁰ to be put into effect when the times reach their fulfillment." Lord in your mercy...

Remember this congregation, its pastor and people, as we share the love of Jesus. Touch those who have asked for prayers with healing, comfort and new life. We name those among us who have asked for prayer. And for what else do the people of God pray or praise? *Lord in your mercy...*

Paul's word of hope continues: "When you believed, you were marked in him with a seal, the promised Holy Spirit, ¹⁴ who is a deposit guaranteeing our inheritance until the redemption of those who are God's possession—to the praise of his glory." Alleluia, Lord God, we give your praise and glory now and forever. In Jesus' mighty name, we pray.

Scripture Reading: Psalm 24

The secret to permanently breaking any bad habit is to love something greater than the habit. —Bryant McGill

In Thailand, elephants are not uncommon. They used to be very important to the economy, especially in the logging industry. But since their use for logging was banned in the 1980s, elephants exist primarily to entertain and delight tourists.

While living in southeast Asia, my wife and I visited Thailand on numerous occasions. We frequently saw elephants. Often, they were idle and just tied with a small rope to a post, much like cowboys used to do in old TV and movie Westerns.

This reminded me of the story of a man passing a couple of Indian elephants in a marketplace of Chiang Mai. He suddenly stopped, confused by the fact that these huge creatures were being held by *only a small rope tied to their front leg*! No chains, no cages. It was obvious that the elephants could, at any time, break away from their bonds. But for some reason, they did not try to get away.

He saw a trainer nearby and asked why these animals just stood there and made no attempt to escape.

"Well," the trainer said, "when they are very young and much smaller we use the same size rope to tie them and, at that age, it's enough to hold them. As they grow up, they are conditioned to believe they cannot break away. They believe the rope can still hold them, so they never try to break free."

Isn't this amazing? Isn't it true that sometimes our bad habits are *learned* behaviors, and once we have learned them, we forget that we can also unlearn them and step away into freedom?

What bad habits do we need to unlearn today? The apostle Paul wrote to the Romans, saying, "Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God — what is good and acceptable and perfect" (Romans 12:2).

To be "conformed" is to look like, behave like, sound like everyone else. Conformity to the world is like an elephant standing mutely by a post, believing that that little tiny rope is strong enough to keep him in his place.

We are bigger than the habits that hold us captive. Our God is bigger than any habits that control us. We can walk away. Those little ropes of sin have no strength or power to tame us! Thanks be to God!




BACKWARDS GEOGRAPHY


KingsMen/KingsKids, July 31 @ 6:30PM
