Genesis 17:1-7, 15-16

The Sign of the Covenant

17 When Abram was ninety-nine years old, the LORD appeared to Abram and said to him, "I am God Almighty; [al] walk before me, and be blameless. ² And I will make my covenant between me and you and will make you exceedingly numerous." ³ Then Abram fell on his face, and God said to him, ⁴ "As for me, this is my covenant with you: You shall be the ancestor of a multitude of nations. ⁵ No longer shall your name be Abram, [bl] but your name shall be Abraham, [cl] for I have made you the ancestor of a multitude of nations. ⁶ I will make you exceedingly fruitful, and I will make nations of you, and kings shall come from you. ⁷ I will establish my covenant between me and you and your offspring after you throughout their generations, for an everlasting covenant, to be God to you and to your offspring after you.

¹⁵ God said to Abraham, "As for Sarai your wife, you shall not call her Sarai, but Sarah shall be her name. ¹⁶ I will bless her and also give you a son by her. I will bless her, and she shall give rise to nations; kings of peoples shall come from her."

SECOND LESSON

Romans 4:13-25

God's Promise Realized through Faith

¹³ For the promise that he would inherit the world did not come to Abraham or to his descendants through the law but through the righteousness of faith. ¹⁴ For if it is the adherents of the law who are to be the heirs, faith is null and the promise is void. ¹⁵ For the law brings wrath, but where there is no law, neither is there transgression.

¹⁶ For this reason the promise depends on faith, in order that it may rest on grace, so that it may be guaranteed to all his descendants, not only to the adherents of the law but also to those who share the faith of Abraham (who is the father of all of us, ¹⁷ as it is written, "I have made you the father of many nations"), in the presence of the God in whom he believed, [a] who gives life to the dead and calls into existence the things that do not exist. ¹⁸ Hoping against hope, he believed that he would become "the father of many nations," according to what was said, "So shall your descendants be." 19 He did not weaken in faith when he considered his own body, which was already as good as dead (for he was about a hundred years old), and the barrenness of Sarah's womb. 20 No distrust made him waver concerning the promise of God, but he grew strong in his faith as he gave glory to God, ²¹ being fully convinced that God was able to do what he had promised. ²² Therefore "it was reckoned to him as righteousness." ²³ Now the words, "it was reckoned to him," were written not for his sake alone 24 but for ours also. It will be reckoned to us who believe [c] in him who raised Jesus our Lord from the dead, ²⁵ who was handed over for our trespasses and was raised for our justification.

Mark 8:31-38

Jesus Foretells His Death and Resurrection

³¹ Then he began to teach them that the Son of Man must undergo great suffering

and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes and be killed and after three days rise again. ³² He said all this quite openly. And Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. ³³ But turning and looking at his disciples, he rebuked Peter and said, "Get behind me, Satan! For you are setting your mind not on divine things but on human things."

³⁴ He called the crowd with his disciples and said to them, "If any wish to come^[a] after me, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. ³⁵ For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake, and for the sake of the gospel, will save it. ³⁶ For what will it profit them to gain the whole world and forfeit their life? ³⁷ Indeed, what can they give in return for their life? ³⁸ Those who are ashamed of me and of my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of them the Son of Man will also be ashamed when he comes in the glory of his Father with the holy angels."

Prayers of the People

Let us pray for the whole people of God in Christ Jesus and for all people according to their needs.

Holy God, you are awesome! From your words to Abraham in Genesis, you have proclaimed who you are, what you expected from humankind and declared your covenant. You stated, "I am God Almighty; walk before me, and be blameless." And I will make my covenant between me and you, and will multiply you exceedingly." That was at the beginning of time; this is the end of time, and your words have been faithful and true. Lord in your mercy...

That initial covenant involved the first miracle of a very unlikely pregnancy. Sarah was an old woman, and yet God promised, "I will give you a son by her; I will bless her, and she shall be a mother of nations." And now we see those words come true. Not only did Abraham and Sarah create the Jewish people through Jacob, but through Ishmael, God created the many tribes that became the Arab people. Lord in your mercy...

We pray for our nation, state and city; our president, governor, mayor and the leaders of the world. By faith in Jesus Christ, we are all children of Abraham, not genetically, but through the blood of Jesus Christ. We were grafted into the Tree of Life on which the God of our salvation died. The birth of Sarah's son, foreshadows the improbable birth of the Virgin Mary's Son. That, too, was a miracle work of the Holy Spirit. Saint Paul, to the church at Rome, reiterates the promise granted to us by faith, he says, "That is why it depends on faith, in order that the promise may rest on grace and be guaranteed to all his descendants." Doesn't that include those nations of Arabs, the sons of other peoples created by Abraham and his offspring? They, too, are included in Abraham's promises...by faith in Jesus Christ, God's Son. Lord in your mercy...

Remember this congregation, its pastor and people, as we share the love of Jesus. Touch those who have asked for prayer with healing, comfort and growth in God's grace. We name those among us who have asked for prayer. And for what else do the people of God pray or praise? *Lord in your mercy...*

Jesus, too, walked the way of faith to the cross, as we hear in today's lesson. Romans continues, "No distrust made him waver concerning the promise of God, but he grew strong in his faith as he gave glory to God, ²¹ fully convinced that God was able to do what he had promised." God raised Him from the dead. He will do the same for us. In Jesus' mighty name, we pray. **Amen.** CAROLYN T. LINN

Scripture Reading: Mark 8:31-38

The most important stuff in this life ... can't be found in the stuff of this life.—James Laurence

In today's Bible reading, Jesus offers a life lesson which might help us decide whether following Jesus is something we want to do: "For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake, and for the sake of the gospel, will save it. For what will it profit them to gain the whole world and forfeit their life?" (vv. 35-36).

When people were asked about what they thought were the most important life lessons to remember, the answers varied. They include:

Forgiveness is the key
Life is all about the journey
Everyone deserves a second chance
Believe in yourself; if you don't, no one will
Face your fears
Treat other people as you want to be treated
Take chances

There are no mistakes, only lessons

Our attitude toward life will determine life's attitude toward us

Sowing gratitude reaps gratitude

Patience is a virtue

These are not bad ideas at all. They are good ideas. But Jesus cuts closer to the heart. He encourages us *to lose our lives*. We probably wouldn't like it if someone said to us, "Get lost!" But this is what Jesus says to us, "Stop being egocentric. Life is not all about you! Lose your consciousness of self. Lose your absorption in self. Abandon yourself. And when you lose your life in this sense, you will then find it!"

Don't understand? Think of those who "get lost" in their pursuit of music — the concert piano, the tenor sax, the cello. Or that person who lives to paint or write. The wonderful thing about losing your life, is that you *love* your life in losing it, and this in turn brings you joy!


