A New Covenant

³¹The days are surely coming, says the LORD, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah. ³² It will not be like the covenant that I made with their ancestors when I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt—a covenant that they broke, though I was their husband, says the LORD. ³³ But this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the LORD: I will put my law within them, and I will write it on their hearts, and I will be their God, and they shall be my people. ³⁴ No longer shall they teach one another or say to each other, "Know the LORD," for they shall all

know me, from the least of them to the greatest, says the LORD, for I will forgive their iniquity and remember their sin no more.

⁷ In the days of his flesh, Jesus^[b] offered up prayers and supplications, with loud cries and tears, to the one who was able to save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverent submission. ⁸ Although he was a Son, he learned obedience through what he suffered, ⁹ and having been made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him, ¹⁰ having been designated by God a high priest according to the order of Melchizedek.

Some Greeks Wish to See Jesus

²⁰ Now among those who went up to worship at the festival were some Greeks. ²¹ They came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and said to him, "Sir, we wish to see Jesus." ²² Philip went and told Andrew, then Andrew and Philip went and told Jesus. ²³ Jesus answered them, "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. ²⁴ Very truly, I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain, but if it dies it bears much fruit. ²⁵ Those who love their life lose it, and those who hate their life in this world

will keep it for eternal life. ²⁶ Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there will my servant be also. Whoever serves me, the Father will honor.

Jesus Speaks about His Death

²⁷ "Now my soul is troubled. And what should I say: 'Father, save me from this hour'? No, it is for this reason that I have come to this hour. ²⁸ Father, glorify your name." Then a voice came from heaven, "I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again." ²⁹ The crowd standing there heard it and said that it was thunder. Others said, "An angel has spoken to him." ³⁰ Jesus answered, "This voice has come for your sake, not for mine. ³¹ Now is the judgment of this world; now the ruler of this world will be driven out. ³² And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people^[a] to myself." ³³ He said this to indicate the kind of death he was to die.

In the lesson from Hebrews, we are taught that Jesus was a role model for all of us. We often struggle with God's ways in our lives. We think all should be well with the God of the Universe always with us. But Hebrews describes Jesus, "Although he was a Son, he learned obedience through what he suffered; and being made perfect he became the source of eternal salvation to all who obey him." There is something about suffering that refines and strengthens our faith if we cling to God. Lord in your mercy...

We pray for our nation, state and city; our president, governor, mayor and the leaders of the world. God's ways are different from the ways of the world. The norm of people around us is to find happiness in material success, pleasure, fame and glory. But God allows His people to suffer in order that they may attain a higher goal of godliness and joy. It is the beginning of kingdom life forever, only lived out here on earth. We are to rejoice in hearing God's words for us and following them, even if it means to the cross. *Lord in your mercy...*

Remember this congregation, its pastor and people, as we share the love of Jesus. Touch those who have asked for prayer with healing, comfort and growth in God's grace. We name those among us who have asked for prayer. And for what else do the people of God pray or praise? *Lord in your mercy...*

Jeremiah declares to God's people, "Behold the days are coming...when I will make a new covenant... I will put my law within them, and I will write it upon their hearts; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people." Yes, Lord, we choose to be your people because we know that a covenant with God will never be broken and will bring eternal life and deepest joy. In Jesus' mighty name, we pray. Amen.

Fifth Sunday in Lent, March 17, 2024

Scripture Reading: John 12:20-33

What you are is God's gift to you; what you become is your gift to God.
—Anon.

A minister, priest and a rabbi — all from Ireland — find themselves in conversation one day. Their encounter quickly turns into a bitter argument. Just as they are about to do something really rash, there's a great thunderclap and a puff of smoke. An angel has appeared in their midst!

"God sends you blessings," announces the angel. "I invite you to make one wish for God Almighty to consider granting to each of you."

The minister jumps right in. "My wish," he says, "is for every Catholic to disappear from our lovely, green island."

The priest is infuriated by this; he responds in kind. "O great Angel, let there be not a single Protestant left on our sacred Irish sod."

"And what about you, rabbi?" the angel asks. "Do you have no wish of your own?"

"No," says the rabbi. "Just attend to the wishes of these two gentlemen and I shall be well pleased."

In today's reading, there were some Greeks in town for the holidays. They came to the disciples and said, "We wish to see Jesus." They don't say why; they don't divulge the nature of the visit. They want to see Jesus.

Whereupon Jesus makes three statements — none of which have anything to do with announcing a pox on any people, ethnicity or religion.

First, Jesus says that only when people deny themselves will anything good happen.

Second, if you want to find your life, you need to first lose your life. In other words, you must become part of something that is bigger than yourself.

Third, if you want to serve Jesus, you must follow Jesus. You cannot serve two masters. If you are going to be a servant of Jesus, you have to be all in.

It is not about being Catholic or Protestant, Southern Baptist or American Baptist, Missouri Synod Lutheran or Evangelical Lutheran, Wesleyan Methodist or United Methodist, and so on. Jesus said, "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified" (v. 23). Indeed. It is about time, don't you think? Time for it to be about Jesus, and not about us.

Prayer: Lord Jesus, like the Greeks of old, I would like to see you, have a chat, a little face-to-face. I am weary of all the confusion generated in your name. Help me to remember the simplicity of being a follower of yours. Amen.




