FIRST LESSON

Acts 14:12-19

¹² Barnabas they called Zeus, and Paul they called Hermes, because he was the chief speaker. ¹³ The priest of Zeus, whose temple was just outside the city, ^[a] brought oxen and garlands to the gates; he and the crowds wanted to offer sacrifice. ¹⁴ When the apostles Barnabas and Paul heard of it, they tore their clothes and rushed out into the crowd, shouting, ¹⁵ "People, ^[b] why are you doing this? We are mortals just like you, and we bring you good news, that you should turn from these worthless things to the living God, who made the heaven and the earth and the sea and all that is in them. ¹⁶ In past generations he allowed all peoples to follow their own ways, ¹⁷ yet he has not left himself without a witness in doing good, giving you rains from heaven and fruitful seasons and filling you with food and your hearts with joy." ¹⁸ Even with these words, they scarcely restrained the crowds from offering sacrifice to them.

¹⁹ But Jews came there from Antioch and Iconium and won over the crowds. Then they stoned Paul and dragged him out of the city, supposing that he was dead.

SECOND LESSON

1 John 3:1-7

3 ¹See what love the Father has given us, that we should be called children of God, and that is what we are. The reason the world does not know us is that it did not know him. ² Beloved, we are God's children now; what we will be has not yet been revealed. What we do know is this: when he^[a] is revealed, we will be like him, for we will see him as he is. ³ And all who have this hope in him purify themselves, just as he is pure.

⁴ Everyone who commits sin is guilty of lawlessness; sin is lawlessness. ⁵ You know that he was revealed to take away sins, and in him there is no sin. ⁶ No one who abides in him sins; no one who sins has either seen him or known him. ⁷ Little children, ^[b] let no one deceive you. Everyone who does what is right is righteous, just as he is righteous.

Luke 24:36b-48

Jesus Appears to His Disciples

startled and terrified and thought that they were seeing a ghost. ³⁸ He said to them, "Why are you frightened, and why do doubts arise in your hearts? ³⁹ Look at my hands and my feet; see that it is I myself. Touch me and see, for a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you see that I have." ⁴⁰ And when he had said this, he showed them his hands and his feet. ^[c] ⁴¹ Yet for all their joy they were still disbelieving and wondering, and he said to them, "Have you anything here to eat?" ⁴² They gave him a piece of broiled fish, ^[d] ⁴³ and he took it and ate in their presence.

⁴⁴Then he said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you—that everything written about me in the law of Moses, the prophets, and the psalms must be fulfilled." ⁴⁵Then he opened their minds to understand the scriptures, ⁴⁶ and he said to them, "Thus it is written, that the Messiah^[e] is^[f] to suffer and to rise from the dead on the third day ⁴⁷ and that repentance and

forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. ⁴⁸ You are witnesses^[g] of these things.

Prayers of the People

Let us pray for the whole people of God in Christ Jesus and for all people according to their needs.

Father God, today's texts give us a glimpse of our heavenly bodies. They will be like the Risen Christ who had certain characteristics: His body was recognizable, but He could walk through walls and move through spaces. Jesus was able to eat food. "He opened their minds to understand the scriptures." 1 John says, "It does not yet appear what we shall be, but we know that when he appears we shall be like him." Lord in your mercy...

After the resurrection, the Apostles were startled and frightened when they first saw Jesus. But the reality of prophecy-fulfilled made them bold in their proclamation. Peter admonished the people to believe, saying, "Repent, therefore, and turn again, that your sins may be blotted out, that times of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord." Lord in your mercy...

We pray for our nation, state and city; our president, governor, mayor and the leaders of the world that the life-changing message of salvation would fill our hearts with peace and joy. 1 John continues, "See what love the Father has given us, that we should be called children of God; and so we are." But a message to our day gives us caution to be strong in faith and in the adherence to God's word. "We are God's children now.... Little children, let no one deceive you." We are living in an evil and adulterous generation. Lord in your mercy...

Remember this congregation, its pastor and people, as we share the love of Jesus. Touch those who have asked for prayer with healing, comfort and resurrection victory. We name those among us who have asked for prayer. And for what else do the people of God pray or praise? *Lord in your mercy...*

The message that was first preached by the Apostles we, too, are to declare, "Thus it is written, that the Christ should suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, and that repentance and forgiveness of sins should be preached in his name to all nations.... You are witnesses of these things." Lord, make us worthy witnesses of the Risen Lord. In Jesus' mighty name, we pray.

Scripture Reading: Luke 24:36b-48 Don't judge each day by the harvest you reap, but by the seeds you plant. —Robert Louis Stevenson

In today's reading, the disciples — minus Judas — have gathered in Jerusalem, along with "their companions" (v. 33) and the two men Jesus encountered on the road to Emmaus (vv. 13-33). Suddenly, Jesus popped unannounced into their midst and said, "BOO!"

Actually, he said, "Peace be with you." But the effect was the same. "They were startled and terrified, and *thought that they were seeing a ghost*" (v. 37, emphasis added).

Have you ever seen a ghost? The disciples thought that what they were seeing was a ghost, like the time they were fishing (see Mark 6:49-50).

What is striking about this reading is Jesus' insistence that he wasn't a ghost. Jesus goes to great pains to demonstrate that he is not a sprite, apparition, phantom or ghost. He quickly establishes the physicality of his presence. "Look at my hands and my feet," he said to them. "See that it is I myself. Touch me and see; for a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you see that I have" (vv. 39-40). At this point, he also "showed them his hands and his feet" (v. 40).

Why the stress on the humanity of Jesus? Many reasons, but one big one is because *Jesus is our brother* — one of us. The writer of Hebrews explains: Jesus "had to become like his brothers and sisters in every respect … because he himself was tested by what he suffered, he is able to help those who are being tested" (Hebrews 2:17-18).

Jesus is one of us. The disciples thought they were seeing a ghost. They were wrong. He was one of them. And if we are to have a ghost of a chance at exper-iencing the power of the resurrected life of Christ, we, too, must put aside any ghost stories. He is risen. Thanks be to God!


