Gentiles Receive the Holy Spirit

⁴⁴ While Peter was still speaking, the Holy Spirit fell upon all who heard the word. ⁴⁵ The circumcised believers who had come with Peter were astounded that the gift of the Holy Spirit had been poured out even on the gentiles, ⁴⁶ for they heard them speaking in tongues and extolling God. Then Peter said, ⁴⁷ "Can anyone withhold the water for baptizing these people who have received the Holy Spirit just as we have?" ⁴⁸ So he ordered them to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. 1 John 5:1-6

Faith Conquers the World

5 Everyone who believes that Jesus is the Christ^[a] has been born of God, and everyone who loves the parent loves the child. ² By this we know that we love the children of God, when we love God and obey his commandments. ³ For the love of God is this, that we obey his commandments. And his commandments are not

burdensome, ⁴ for whatever is born of God conquers the world. And this is the victory that conquers the world, our faith. ⁵ Who is it who conquers the world but the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God?

Prayers of the People

Let us pray for the whole people of God in Christ Jesus and for all people according to their needs.

Heavenly Father, we ask: How do we please God? Today's texts give the simple answer: "We love God and obey his commandments" Yes, the Jewish people had abundant laws and regulations, but we know the first ten God gave us. And our lesson says that "His commandments are not burdensome." That's the way we can have victory over the sin that dwells within us. 1 John tells us, "For whatever is born of God overcomes the world; and <u>this</u> is the victory that overcomes the world, our faith." **Lord, in your mercy...**

We pray for our nation, state and city; our president, governor, mayor and the leaders of the world. When we walk in God's ways, we live in joy. Jesus says, "These things I have spoken to you, that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be full." He continues, "You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you that you should go and bear fruit and that your fruit should abide; so that whatever you ask the Father in my name, he may give it to you." What a gift God has given humankind! The Creator of All Things loves us and promises to answer our prayers and fill our lives with joy. Lord in your mercy...

Remember this congregation, its pastor and people, as we share the love of Jesus. Touch those who have asked for prayer with healing, comfort and resurrection victory. We name those among us who have asked for prayer. And for what else do the people of God pray or praise? *Lord in your mercy...*

Jesus says, "You are my friends if you do what I command you. If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love." And Jesus' final word to us is, "This I command you, to love one another." In His mighty name, we pray. Amen. Carolyn T. Linn

Scripture Reading: John 15:9-17

Knowledge is knowing what to say. Wisdom is knowing when to say it. —Anonymous

I don't know what my IQ is — fairly confident that it's over 100, and equally certain that it's below 150. The problem with IQ tests is that they only assess analytical intelligence. They do not address the creative, emotional and practical aspects of human intelligence.

When we were growing up, we were taught very little about how to be wise. Maybe we picked up a few things in Sunday school. But we were definitely advised as to the necessity of getting good grades, scoring well on tests, passing entrance exams and so on.

And then, suddenly, we were 25, and we're supposed to be mature and make decisions with the wisdom of Solomon. Remember those days? We were young — and foolish. Is there a correlation between old age and wisdom?

Wisdom, often regarded as the pinnacle of human intellect, transcends mere knowledge and intelligence. You can't go to a university and get a B.A. in Wisdom. You can't declare Wisdom as a college major. Wisdom is the result of a deep understanding of life, a profound sense of empathy, and a commitment to making thoughtful and ethical decisions.

So, would you consider yourself wise? Most people would agree that wise people are *empathetic*. Perhaps this is what Jesus is getting at when he says in today's Bible reading that we should "love one another" (v. 12). People with love in their hearts possess the ability to understand and share the feelings of others. They can put themselves in someone else's shoes and see the world from their perspective. This empathetic approach fosters compassion, tolerance and the ability to resolve conflicts peacefully. No wonder wise people are able to offer valuable support and guidance to those in need.

There are other indicators of wisdom, of course. Wise people are also *prudent*. They are *humble*. Wise people are also persons of *integrity*.

But mostly, wise people have spiritual intelligence. And at the top of the list of what it means to be spiritually intelligent is *love*. See 1 Corinthians 13:13.


