I myself will transplant it on a high and lofty mountain.





Prayers of the People

Let us pray for the whole people of God in Christ Jesus and for all people according to their needs.

Holy Father, your word says that you alone will cause us to flourish. In Ezekiel, the prophet declares that God alone will take a sprig from the top of a lofty cedar and make of it a tree that will produce boughs and bear fruit and become a place where birds can nest. *Lord in your mercy...*

In our Gospel lesson from Mark, Jesus uses a similar metaphor about the earth. "The earth produces of itself first the stalk, then the head, then the full grain in the head. But when the grain is ripe, at once [the farmer] goes in with his sickle because the harvest has come." We do God's work, and God produces the harvest of souls for the kingdom. Lord in your mercy...

We pray for our nation, state and city; our president, governor, mayor and the leaders of the world. Lord, the earth groans under the load of sin, whether it is violations of the earth itself, sin working among nations through warfare or our personal lives. Sin brings pain and suffering in our bodies and minds and hatred in our hearts. Saint Paul reminds us that "All of us must appear before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each may receive due recompense for actions done in the body, whether good or evil." But the answer to all of life's ills is found in Jesus Christ. "And [Jesus Christ] died for all, so that those who live might live no longer for themselves but for the one who for their sake died and was raised."

Remember this congregation, its pastor and people, as we share the love of Jesus. Touch those who have asked for prayer with healing, comfort and new life in Jesus Christ. We name those among us who have asked for prayer. And for what else do the people of God pray or praise? *Lord in your mercy...*

We know that we have salvation through the blood of Jesus. "So, if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; look, new things have come into being!" That is our hope for now and for eternity: to be new creatures in Christ Jesus. We give you thanks and praise for this new life, Lord. Thanks be to God who gives us the victory in our Lord Jesus Christ. In His mighty name, we pray. Amen.

ften, people who meet me for the first time will remark, "Well, you don't *look* like a preacher!"

I usually counter with, "So, what's a preacher *supposed* to look like?" I suspect that many people think that preachers are supposed to look like undertakers or accountants. But, that brings up the question of what undertakers and accountants are supposed to look like. For me, the answer is that accountants and undertakers are supposed to wear dark suits, have slick, greasy hair, and pocket protectors stuffed with Bic ballpoint pens. A stereotype for sure!

A couple of generations ago, preachers were definitely men, as were most doctors and lawyers. On television, comedy shows often had scenes where the patient was waiting for his doctor, confused when a woman showed up saying she was Dr. So-and-So. "Well, you don't look like a doctor!" No, she didn't, because doctors 50 years ago were overwhelmingly men. Thankfully, that's all changed now.

In today's Bible reading, the prophet Samuel is having trouble identifying Israel's next king, the man God wants to move Israel forward. As he looked upon the sons of Jesse, he saw a number of lads who looked like future kings. But God said, "No, the future king is a shepherd. He's out in the meadow tending sheep and playing his lyre."

When Samuel saw this kid, I am sure he thought, "You don't look like a king!"

But God told Samuel, "Do not look on his appearance or on the height of his stature, because I have rejected him; for the LORD does not see as mortals see; they look on the outward appearance, but the LORD looks on the heart" (v. 7)

David would become a man whom the Bible describes as a man after God's own heart.

We humans tend to look at outward appearances and make rash judgments. God looks inside. And when God looks at us, what does God see? Do we look like someone who believes and trusts in God? Do we look like a person who sees others as God sees them?

We often go to a lot of trouble to ensure that our outward appearance looks just so. But let's not forget to take care of our inner appearance, because it is our inner self that determines who we really are.
