# Life in the Spirit

**8** Therefore there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus. <sup>2</sup> For the law of the Spirit<sup>[a]</sup> of life in Christ Jesus has set you<sup>[b]</sup> free from the law of sin

and of death. <sup>3</sup> For God has done what the law, weakened by the flesh, could not do: by sending his own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh and to deal with sin, <sup>[c]</sup> he condemned sin in the flesh, <sup>4</sup> so that the just requirement of the law might be fulfilled in us, who walk not according to the flesh but according to the Spirit. <sup>[d]</sup> <sup>5</sup> For those who live according to the flesh set their minds on the things of the flesh, but those who live according to the Spirit <sup>[e]</sup> set their minds on the things of the Spirit. <sup>[f]</sup> <sup>6</sup> To set the mind on the flesh is death, but to set the mind on the Spirit <sup>[g]</sup> is life and peace. <sup>7</sup> For this reason the mind that is set on the flesh is hostile to God; it does not submit to God's law—indeed, it cannot, <sup>8</sup> and those who are in the flesh cannot please God.

<sup>9</sup> But you are not in the flesh; you are in the Spirit, <sup>[h]</sup> since the Spirit of God dwells in you. Anyone who does not have the Spirit of Christ does not belong to him. <sup>10</sup> But if Christ is in you, then the body is dead because of sin, but the Spirit <sup>[i]</sup> is life because of righteousness. <sup>11</sup> If the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, he who raised Christ Jesus <sup>[i]</sup> from the dead will give life to your mortal bodies also through <sup>[k]</sup> his Spirit that dwells in you.

#### **GOSPEL**

Matthew 13:1-9, 18-23

#### The Parable of the Sower

13 That same day Jesus went out of the house and sat beside the sea. <sup>2</sup> Such great crowds gathered around him that he got into a boat and sat there, while the whole crowd stood on the beach. <sup>3</sup> And he told them many things in parables, saying: "Listen! A sower went out to sow. <sup>4</sup> And as he sowed, some seeds fell on a path, and the birds came and ate them up. <sup>5</sup> Other seeds fell on rocky ground, where they did not have much soil, and they sprang up quickly, since they had no depth of soil. <sup>6</sup> But when the sun rose, they were scorched, and since they had no root, they withered away. <sup>7</sup> Other seeds fell among thorns, and the thorns grew

up and choked them. <sup>8</sup> Other seeds fell on good soil and brought forth grain, some a hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty. <sup>9</sup> If you have ears, <sup>[a]</sup> hear!"

# The Parable of the Sower Explained

<sup>18</sup> "Hear, then, the parable of the sower. <sup>19</sup> When anyone hears the word of the kingdom and does not understand it, the evil one comes and snatches away what is sown in the heart; this is what was sown on the path. <sup>20</sup> As for what was sown on rocky ground, this is the one who hears the word and immediately receives it with joy, <sup>21</sup> yet such a person has no root but endures only for a while, and when trouble or persecution arises on account of the word, that person immediately falls away. <sup>[a]</sup> <sup>22</sup> As for what was sown among thorns, this is the one who hears the word, but the cares of this <sup>[b]</sup> age and the lure of wealth choke the word, and it yields nothing. <sup>23</sup> But as for what was sown on good soil, this is the one who hears the word and understands it, who indeed bears fruit and yields in one case a hundredfold, in another sixty, and in another thirty."

# Scripture Reading: Isaiah 55

Where the will of God leads you, the grace of God will keep you. — Anon.

Today's reading from Isaiah features an invitation. In verses 1-3, the prophet Isaiah, speaking for God, utters a dozen imperative verbs, a full one-third of which are the command to "come." "Come to the waters; come, buy and eat; come, buy; come to me," he cries. And then in verse 6, he adds, "Seek the LORD while he may be found, call upon him while he is near; ... return to the LORD, that he may have mercy on [you] and to our God, for he will abundantly pardon" (vv. 6-7).

Sounds like an invitation. And if it sounded familiar to the ears of Isaiah's readers, that's only because it was. In those days, a recently crowned king would celebrate his ascension to the throne by announcing that his royal subjects were released from all debts. They were given a fresh start. This was only the beginning. To celebrate the king's new rule, he often called for a banquet. In towns, villages and hamlets, food was copious, and wine flowed freely. It was all designed to signal the dawning of a new day under the beneficent reign of a new king.

Enter Isaiah, acting as a herald for the new king: "Ho, everyone who thirsts, come to the waters!" (v. 1).

What an invitation! "Come, buy wine and milk without money and without price" (v. 1). What a deal! There's more of course, and usually when God is involved, there's always more.

So how will we respond to this invitation?

Regretfully declines? You have "other engagements." You're really a little too busy right now to get serious about faith and the practice of faith. Everyone wants a piece of you, and there's not enough "you" to go around. This sounds like the invitation of a lifetime, but it comes at a really bad time. "I'll have to take a raincheck. Sorry."

Not sure? We say to God, "Let me think about it for a while." Or, we say: "Maybe ... Whether or not I accept your gracious invitation sort of depends on circumstances. I am in the middle of things right now, but I might get clarity soon, and when I do, I will be able to say whether I am all in, or all out. I'm just not sure."

God bless you if you are able to say, "Joyfully accepts!" This invitation of amazing grace is far-ranging — casting a big, divine net of mercy and forgiveness. We are all sinners, we are all thirsty, we are all in need of divine food, and God is ready and willing to satisfy our need.

We turn to Jesus. We stay close to Him. He has the answer for all our trials and difficulties. And we become the sower, the sower of Good News to our hurting world. We share the Good News of Jesus and his salvation. *Lord in your mercy...* 

Remember this congregation its pastor and people as we share the love of Jesus. Touch those who have asked for prayer with healing, comfort and the power of God. We name those among us who have asked for prayer. And for what else do the people of God pray or praise? *Lord in your mercy...* 

Yes, Lord God, we turn to you, the Creator of the Universe, the powerful God of all things, the Lord and Savior of our lives. In God's words through Isaiah, we hear, "So shall my word be that goes forth from my mouth; it shall not return to me empty, but it shall accomplish that which I purpose, and prosper in the thing for which I sent it." And what will be the result: Again, Isaiah tells us, "For you shall go out in joy, and be led forth in peace; the mountains and the hills before you shall break forth into singing." All the Earth shall rejoice to the glory of God the Father. In the mighty name of Jesus, we pray. Amen.
