#### **Feeding the Five Thousand**

of Tiberias. [a] <sup>2</sup> A large crowd kept following him because they saw the signs that he was doing for the sick. <sup>3</sup> Jesus went up the mountain and sat down there with his disciples. <sup>4</sup> Now the Passover, the festival of the Jews, was near. <sup>5</sup> When he looked up and saw a large crowd coming toward him, Jesus said to Philip, "Where are we to buy bread for these people to eat?" <sup>6</sup> He said this to test him, for he himself knew what he was going to do. <sup>7</sup> Philip answered him, "Two hundred denarii would not buy enough bread for each of them to get a little." <sup>8</sup> One of his disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, said to him, <sup>9</sup> "There is a boy here who has five barley loaves and two fish. But what are they among so many people?" <sup>10</sup> Jesus said, "Make the people sit down." Now there was a great deal of grass in the place, so they<sup>[b]</sup> sat down, about five thousand in all. <sup>11</sup> Then Jesus

took the loaves, and when he had given thanks he distributed them to those who were seated; so also the fish, as much as they wanted. <sup>12</sup> When they were satisfied, he told his disciples, "Gather up the fragments left over, so that nothing may be lost." <sup>13</sup> So they gathered them up, and from the fragments of the five barley loaves, left by those who had eaten, they filled twelve baskets. <sup>14</sup> When the people saw the sign that he had done, they began to say, "This is indeed the prophet who is to come into the world."

<sup>15</sup> When Jesus realized that they were about to come and take him by force to make him king, he withdrew again to the mountain by himself.

<sup>16</sup> When evening came, his disciples went down to the sea, <sup>17</sup> got into a boat, and started across the sea to Capernaum. It was now dark, and Jesus had not yet come to them. <sup>18</sup> The sea became rough because a strong wind was blowing. <sup>19</sup> When they had rowed about three or four miles, they saw Jesus walking on the sea and coming near the boat, and they were terrified. <sup>20</sup> But he said to them, "It is I; <sup>[C]</sup> do not be afraid." <sup>21</sup> Then they wanted to take him into the boat, and immediately the boat reached the land toward which they were going.

# Scripture Reading: John 6:1-21

# The hunger for love is much more difficult to remove than the hunger for bread. —Mother Teresa



The Paris Olympics began two days ago and, in practical terms, this means that every day more than 15,000 athletes will need three square meals a day. Not to worry. The French have this covered. The participants are feasting on fresh baguettes, gourmet dishes and environment-friendly French cuisine—enjoying some of the 40,000 meals a day at the Olympic Village served up by some of France's renowned chefs.

Alexandre Mazzia, whose AM restaurant in Marseille earned three Michelin guide stars, is serving a dish made of crushed chickpeas with herbs and a smoked fish sauce. Other chefs unveiled dishes that included an elaborate quinoa risotto and a chocolate mousse with raspberries. The athletes "know they will eat well here," said one spokesperson. "Our goal is to provide them with high-quality food."

The eatery at the Olympic Village seats 3,500 people, making it perhaps the largest restaurant — for the time being — in the world.

In the gospel lesson for today, Jesus faces the problem of feeding 5,000 men. But there were also the women and children. The disciples were going to send the crowds away. After all, they had no food and babies were crying and people were murmuring.

In the training manual for Ritz-Carlton Hotel employees, there's a maxim that says, "If you see a problem, you own it." To say, "It's not my problem" or "It's not my job" is not acceptable. If you see a problem, you own it — you take responsibility.

So, in this spirit, according to Matthew, Jesus says to the disciples, "*You* give them something to eat" (Matthew 14:16, emphasis added). Jesus doesn't do the reasonable thing here, the rational thing, but turns the problem into an opportunity — a teachable moment. *You* give them something to eat.

Fortunately, a boy stepped up with five baguettes and two fish. It was more than enough. Everyone got their fill.

When we accept Jesus' challenge to feed those who are around us, the meal will be provided and there will be plenty to go around.

Prayer: Lord Jesus, loaves and fish are yours to distribute as you see fit. May I have eyes to see those who are hungry and in need of my help. In your name. Amen.
