

The Hours - by Michael Cunningham



Passionate, profound, and deeply moving, *The Hours* draws inventively on the life and work of Virginia Woolf to tell the story of a group of contemporary characters struggling with the

conflicting claims of love and inheritance, hope and despair. The narrative of Woolf's last days before her suicide early in World War II counterpoints the fictional stories of Samuel, a famous poet whose life has been shadowed by his talented and troubled mother, and his lifelong friend Clarissa, who strives to forge a balanced and rewarding life in spite of

the demands of friends, lovers, and family. Author of *The Hours*, Michael Cunningham, has been widely praised as one of the most gifted writers of his generation.

This is another book that should provide for great discussion! Please join us, **Sunday**, **April 27**, at **4:00** in the Community Center for casual discussion of "The Hours". We are not deeply structured, but do spend an hour discussing our book of the month. Join us in any month where the book strikes your fancy.


Wednesday Evening Bible Study


