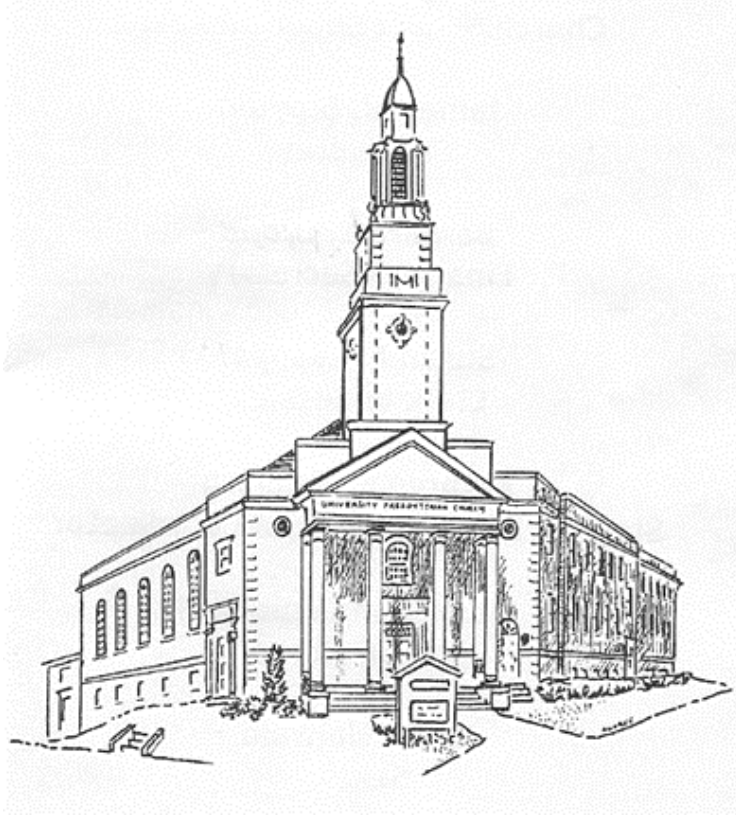

Statement on Ordination

Profession of Faith

Trusting in the gracious mercy of God, do you turn from the ways of sin and renounce evil and its power in the world? **I do.**

Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Lord and Savior, trusting in his grace and love? **I do.**

Will you be Christ's faithful disciple, obeying his Word and showing his love? **I will, with God's help.**

On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

Constitutional Questions

To the deacons and elders being installed:

Will you be governed by our church's polity, and will you abide by its discipline? Will you be a friend among your colleagues in ministry, working with them, subject to the ordering of God's Word and Spirit?

I will.

Will you in your own life seek to follow the Lord Jesus Christ, love your neighbors, and work for the reconciliation of the world? **I will.**

Do you promise to further the peace, unity, and purity of the church?

I do.

Will you pray for and seek to serve the people with energy, intelligence, imagination, and love? **I will.**

To the deacons being installed:

Will you be a faithful deacon, teaching charity, urging concern, and directing the people's help to the friendless and those in need, and in your ministry will you try to show the love and justice of Jesus Christ? **I will.**

To the elders being installed:

Will you be a faithful ruling elder, watching over the people, providing for their worship, nurture, and service? Will you share in government and discipline, serving in councils of the church, and in your ministry will you try to show the love and justice of Jesus Christ? **I will.**

To the members of University Presbyterian Church:

Do we, the members of the church, accept Kathy Hallborg and Amy Maundrell as deacons and Dennis Erickson, Jude Hammer, Shirley Herman, Eric Maundrell, and Gary Melius as a ruling elders, chosen by God through the voice of this congregation to lead us in the way of Jesus Christ? **We do.**

Do we agree to pray for them, to encourage them, to respect their decisions, and to follow as they guide us, serving Jesus Christ, who alone is Head of the Church? **We do.**

Today's service music honors and celebrates "Black History Month". The Prelude, Offertory and Postlude were composed by Phillip B. McIntyre who served as organist at six large churches in the Washington, DC area. Born in 1951, he received his degrees from Catholic University, University of the District of Columbia, and Westminster Choir College. McIntyre was well-known for his ability to take choir members without formal training and transform them into well-trained choirs. He was a student of Daniel Roth, Titular Organist at Saint-Sulpice, Paris. Today's service music is most likely taken from his many improvisations. These compositions utilize warm solo stops accompanied by rich harmonies; various tone colors on the UPC Kegg Organ highlight the beauty of these familiar melodies. McIntyre's organ music places his compositions along-side some of the most celebrated African-American organists and composers. Phillip B. McIntyre died on March 21, 1991, at the young age of 40. It was said at his memorial service: "Phillip always demanded excellence in himself." "Whenever anyone thought of excellence in music they thought of Phillip Barnette McIntyre."
