Dear University Presbyterian Church Congration,

Thank you for your recent donation to the Western New York Land Conservancy to save Mossy Point. I am sincerely grateful for your contribution now, as we approach our deadline. I am confident that you and the rest of our community will be able to celebrate soon.

Mossy Point is one of the most impressive places in our region. A deep gorge there reveals millions of years of geologic history. Old growth trees tell us what our forests used to look like. Hill tops overlooking hidden glades and valleys offer views of endless, unbroken tree canopy. This place is full of memories of families coming together and exploring nature. Protecting Mossy Point forever is critical.



Once you and the rest of our community save Mossy Point, it will become a new nature preserve with trails so that people of all ages can experience its impressive oaks, its rolling hills, and the cold waters of Hunters Creek. Great-horned Owls will always be able to raise their young in nests at the tops of the tallest hemlocks. Colorful salamanders will continue to make their homes in small, untouched pools of water. Crayfish will hide amongst the rocks beneath small waterfalls.

I raised my children right here in Western New York because of places like Mossy Point. We spent countless days splashing in our streams, listening to birds sing in our meadows, and walking through our forests. Because of you, I know that the next generation of Western New Yorkers will have these same opportunities.

Racial Justice Task Group Sponsors a Book Discussion

The Racial Justice Task Group of University and North Presbyterian Churches invites our two congregations participate in reading and discussing Toni Morrison's *The Bluest Eye.*



Recipient of both the Nobel and Pulitzer Prizes, Toni Morrison is considered one of America's greatest literary talents and treasures. Before her death in 2019, Morrison received great acclaim for her many novels which include: *The Bluest Eye, Beloved,* and *Song of Solomon.* While many of her novels are quite substantial in length, *The Bluest Eye* is modest in size and thus it may offer a less intimidating introduction to readers who are new to Morrison.

The novel focuses upon Pecola Breedlove, a young black girl who prays every day for beauty. Mocked by other children for the dark skin, curly hair, and brown eyes that set her apart, she yearns to have blond hair and blue eyes. The novel is a powerful examination of our obsession with beauty and conformity and asks important questions about race, class, and gender with the subtlety and grace that have always characterized Morrison's writing.

The Racial Justice Task Group invites our two congregations to read this book during the month of January. Then, on **Sunday, February 9 at 2 p.m.** those who wish are invited to gather at University Presbyterian Church for a book discussion. Refreshments will be provided.
