## Message from our Pastor

Welcoming the stranger is one of Jesus' core teachings. We have an opportunity to live out this important lesson with the resettlement of Afghan evacuees in our region.

We all watched on TV the scenes of desperate Afghans attempting to enter the airport and flee their country in advance of the Taliban takeover. We can only imagine their anxiety and fear. But even when safely out of their country, they face yet more uncertainty and anxiety. What will become of them? Where will they live? How will they earn a living? Having left behind their livelihoods, their possessions, their family and friends, their culture and all that is familiar their world has been turned upside down.

We in Buffalo have an opportunity to extend assistance to some of these Afghan evacuees and to help them find their footing on solid ground.

Afghan evacuees do not fall under the U.S. definition of "refugee" and thus do not qualify for many services afforded to refugees. The five refugee and immigration organizations in Buffalo have joined together to assist these Afghan individuals and families and the sizeable needs they will have in making Buffalo home.
