### Message from our Pastor

Five years ago I created a sermon series based on the Gospel of Mark which I preached during the season of Advent and on Christmas Eve. The series emerged because I wanted to find a fresh approach to the season and was intrigued whether Mark's gospel, which contains no account of Jesus' birth or childhood, could nevertheless offer us a meaningful message. The response from you at UPC was favorable and I decided to expand upon these sermons to create a book—an Advent resource for individuals and congregations. That process took another three years of on and off writing, as time permitted.

When I was finished writing, I was thrilled to have the book accepted for publication by Westminster John Knox Press, the publishing arm of the Presbyterian Church (USA). Then came another two years of waiting until WJK could add it into its publication schedule. But finally this fall the book, *Holy Disruption: Discovering Advent in the Gospel of Mark*, has been released in time for the season of Advent.


I have you at UPC to thank for creating an accepting environment for me to try out such an unconventional Advent topic! Unlike the conventional cozy Christmastime messages we


#### **Another UPC Author**

"Saving Buffalo Baseball: The 1956 Season" takes the reader into the on-field and off-field struggles of a new phenomenon in the Queen City—community owned professional baseball, following the team on a month by month, game by game saga from September 1955 to the hard-scrabble conclusion of the 1956 baseball year. Experience the doubts and disappointments and day to day heroics of what dedicated men (and some women) could achieve if only they stayed true to the cause. Starting from nothing, within three years' time the Buffalo Bisons became the top drawing ball club in all of minor league baseball and with a valuation of more than half a million dollars!

The National Council of Churches Vote Empowerment Campaign encourages all persons to "register or check their registration, so they are 'vote ready' come election day," Tuesday, November 8, 2022.

New York offers <u>online voter registration</u>. You can register by mail to vote in New York by printing a voter registration form, filling it out, and mailing it to your local election office. You can also register to vote in person if you prefer. The deadline to register to vote in New York State is October 14, 2022.

#### <u>Check registration status</u> · <u>Register to vote</u>

Who can register to vote? To register in New York you must:

be a citizen of the United States

be a resident of this state and the county, city or village for at least 30 days before the election

be 18 years old (you may pre-register at 16 or 17 but cannot vote until you are 18) not be in prison for a felony conviction

not currently be judged mentally incompetent by order of a court of competent judicial authority

not claim the right to vote elsewhere
