Message from our Pastor

Signs of hope and new life come in strange forms. Like an empty tomb. Or a vaccination syringe. As more and more of us get vaccinated, we are like the first crocus blossoms of spring—gradually emerging into the world once again, a bit tentative as to whether we can trust the warmth of the sun or whether we are in for another deep freeze.

The events of this past year have been traumatic for us individually and collectively. As we emerge back into some semblance of "normalcy," we cannot expect to pick up life where it left off before the pandemic and to be unchanged by all that has transpired. The loss of life, the loss of economic well-being, the stress we've endured, the disruption to our plans and dreams, have all left their mark upon us. We move out of this pandemic as altered people.

The mid-week Bible class was recently discussing the topic of "spiritual resiliency." The question before us was how we maintain a sense of hope and well-being even in the face of life's pressures and traumas. And the discussion centered around the belief that we are connected to something greater than ourselves. Our life's story is part of a larger narrative: the story of God's steadfast love and grace. And knowledge of that can make us "resilient."

The Resurrection is the celebration of God's gift of spiritual resiliency. We have not been abandoned to the dark traumas of this world or to the dark elements within ourselves. At the Resurrection, the God of steadfast love and grace defeats that darkness and death. And thus we can face life's hardships and our own imperfection and sin with resiliency. We will be changed, for sure. But we can also experience the gift of new life. For Christ is risen! Christ is risen indeed!


