

**Today's Adult Education Hour:** Our Adult Education hour (11:45 - 12:45) will host Dr James Maynard, Curator at University at Buffalo Libraries' Poetry Collection. Dr. Maynard is currently overseeing the completion of the new James Joyce Museum, which will be housed in Abbott Hall on UB's South Campus - across the street from UPC. The noted Irish novelist, poet, and literary critic, James Joyce (1882-1941), will be UPC's new neighbor! Dr. Maynard's presentation will focus on the importance of James Joyce within 20th century English language literature, describe how UB acquired the world's largest collection of James Joyce materials, and explain the value of a publicly accessible James Joyce Museum to the greater Western New York Community.
