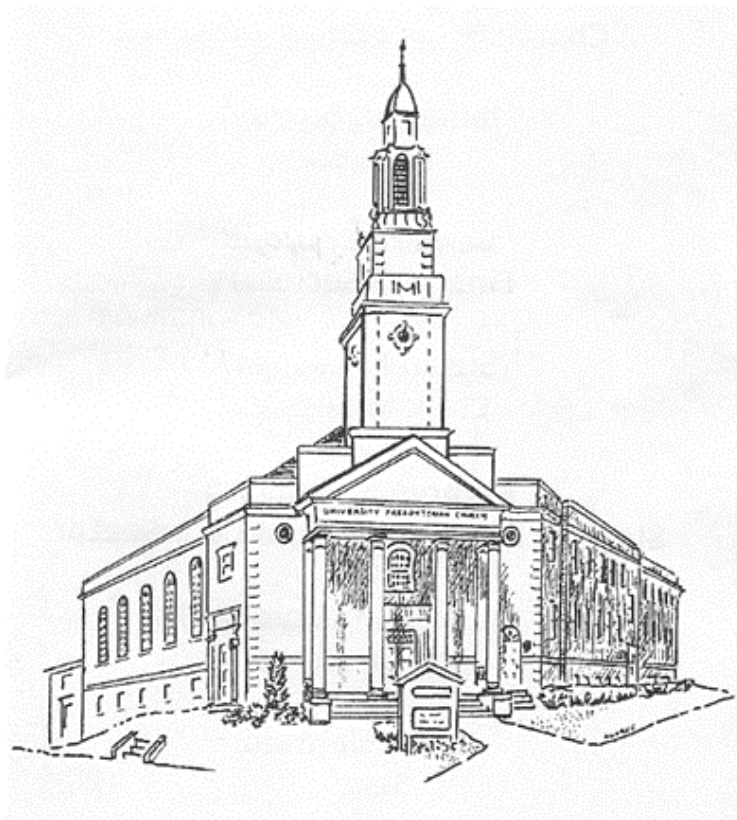

January 18 Adult Education Hour: On Sunday January 18, UPC's Adult Education hour (11:45 - 12:45) will host Dr James Maynard, Curator at University at Buffalo Libraries' Poetry Collection.
