

The Session of UPC has altered some of UPC's Covid protocols and practices...

Beginning Sunday, May 23rd:

- ◆ Masks will be **optional** during worship services for those who are fully vaccinated, and **required** for those who are not yet vaccinated.
- Masks will still be **required** in the building during weekday business hours. Food Pantry volunteers and clients and members coming to the Church Office during weekdays must wear a mask in the building.
- In addition to the Ramp Entrance and the Front Entrance, worshippers may once again use the Parking Lot Entrance, elevator and 2nd floor corridors on Sunday mornings to access the sanctuary and the 2nd floor restrooms.

Adult Class for June

All of these titles accurately describe the Sermon on the Mount which is what we will be exploring during the 5 weeks in June.

Tracy will lead the class in exploring these biblical texts using the book *Sermon on the Mount* by Amy-Jill Levine. Dr. Levine is a Jewish New Testament scholar who invites us to hear the Jewishness of Jesus' words and to understand them in light of the world in which Jesus lived.

You do not need to purchase the book to join the class but you are certainly welcome to do so if you wish. You may, however, find it helpful to read the Sermon on the Mount beforehand. It can be found in the Gospel of Matthew chapters 5-7.

Volunteers Needed!


Would you like to help beautify the sanctuary on a Sunday morning with chancel flowers...sign up on the bulletin board.
