### **June Session Meeting Highlights**

- The pre-work for the Capital Campaign has started. Recommended actions:
- Renovations to the front of the church including front and side doors being scraped & painted, flashing repaired, bushes removed and new landscaping installed, and concrete repaired. Target completion date: Rally Day. The steeple is lit again!
- -Technology & Communication Updates include a computerized LED sign to be installed in existing structure, redesign and brand website, research office management systems (software).
- -Outreach & Visioning: Working with Buffalo State University to identify a unified vision.
- Jim Smyton will co-chair the capital Campaign Cabinet.
- The session has approved offering space for the PFLAG Buffalo/Niagara organization to rent space once a month for meetings. This is a local chapter of a national organization dedicated to supporting families when a loved one comes out. They also work to educate the public about LGBTQ+ persons and issues.

- PNC reported to Session that a candidate has been selected and interviewed. They have seen the candidate preach several times. The PNC is following all the steps the Presbytery requires and more updates will be announced.
