Dear UPC Members and Friends,

A few years ago, on sabbatical, spending much of my time in New England I made a point of finding and reading the war memorials in the small towns I visited and stayed in. Typically, memorials would include multiple wars and honor the names of those who gave their lives in each war. It was not unusual to see the same surname repeated three, four, even five times from the same war; which led me to surmise that these were fathers and sons, brothers, uncles, nephews and cousins from the same family who'd made the ultimate sacrifice. Sometimes I ran my finger slowly over the raised letters of their names, sometimes I'd say the names out loud—which brought their sacrifice and loss of life closer to me.

Part of my motivation to take notice of the memorials was our son's deployment to Afghanistan in combat arms in the US Army. Carol and I lived through that time simplifying, quieting day to day life. And praying of course. Carol was active in Blue Star mothers which supports family members who are deployed. Occasionally, a Blue Star mother would become a Gold Star mother after a son or daughter was lost in the fighting. It was a sobering experience and time in our life as a family.


Memorial Day, like many holidays (Christmas!) can become all about a day off, time to plant the garden, take a trip, and shop the sales. So I pen these words to remind us, if we need reminding, to pause in the midst of this Memorial Day to remember those who died for our country and offer a prayer of thanksgiving for them and for what they died for—our cherished freedoms, rights and benefits as a Constitutional democracy. Something Ben Franklin said we will have only "if we can keep it." Implying that it is our responsibility, each one, to be exercise our freedoms and keep the forces of authoritarianism at bay.

June 8 is Pentecost Sunday. We will celebrate the day with a hot dog cookout after worship for all ages and by receiving the Pentecost offering which this year will be devoted entirely to Camp Duffield camperships. Twenty-six children from the East Side will attend the camp—children who do not usually have a chance to spend a week in nature, telling stories by fireside, and taking creek walks. Our Clerk of Session, Pat Cookfair-Casseri, is the Director of the camp. She continues a tradition of family volunteering at the camp that started with her mother many years ago. I hope you'll consider a generous gift for the camp.

Finally, following this past Sunday's congregation meeting and the report made by Dana Kimberly of Danforth Development the session will meet in early June to approve next steps, we will report back to you regarding what those will be. If you have any questions regarding the Feasibility Study or would like a copy of the entire report please let us know in the church office.

Camp Duffield



UPC and Camp Duffield share a rich history, and that connection continues today through the involvement of many of our members who actively volunteer at the camp. As you might know Pat Cookfair-Casseri serves as camp director.

Since 1950 Camp Duffield has offered campers of all ages and backgrounds the opportunity to enjoy the sights and sounds of God's beautiful creation! Some of us at UPC have been campers and participants in programs there. Remember the fun you had?

During the summer, Duffield, Inc. conducts Christian camping programs for 1st graders and up. It features a camp for adults with developmental disabilities, as well as traditional camping experiences for youth.

We are blessed to have an opportunity to help Camp Duffield. Their policy is to never turn away a child due to an inability to pay the \$320 fee. There are 26 registered campers from the East Side of Buffalo who need camperships. Presbytery and individual donations provide some funding, but more is needed.

The Ministry to Community Committee recommended and Session approved that 100% of the Pentecost offering on June 8, 2025, be donated to support scholarships this year for students to attend Camp Duffield.

Notes from May Meetings

Session Highlights from May 2025

Dana Kimberly presented the Capital Campaign Feasibility Study Final Report and answered questions. The report's recommendations will be presented to the congregation for a vote on May $18^{\rm th}$.

The report recommends the following that UPC takes the following steps:

Vision: A Self-Study Process to Determine a Unified Future and Identity

Communication Plan: Develop a Communication Plan to Formally Communicate with our External Natural Constituency. Base Content on Outcomes from the Campaign Research and Visioning Process. Use Website and Social Media First.

Publish: Well written Professionally Designed and Printed Publication-about the Future to Distribute to our Natural Constituency- Neighbors, UB, Leaders.

Recruit: Organize the Capital Campaign recruiting internal and external Voluntary Leaders.

Organize: Organize prospects and create a cultivation and solicitation strategy for each.

Solicitation: Begin Grant Seeking, Solicitation of Members, Corporate Sponsors, Community Leaders and Neighbors.

The report suggested the following timeline:

- May 2025- Approve Recommendations from study, Visioning Self- Study, Create Communication Plan, Begin writing Publication and Implementation Plan
- July 2025 to Sept 2025- Prioritize Projects, Recruit Campaign Cabinet, Prepare Proposals for Grants and Lead Gifts, Approach Corporate Sponsors and Community Prospects.
- Sept 2025 to Sept 2026- Finalize Leadership Gifts, Apply for Local and /national Foundation Grants, Member Solicitations.
- Sept 2026- Open the Doors!, Light Up the Tower! Pursue r Invite Final Community Gifts.
- Oct 2026 to January 2027- Top Priority Projects completed, On-site Community Event, Stewardship and Communication Plan Continues.


The Session approved that 100% of the special offering collected on Pentecostal Sunday be
