The Invitation:

THE GREAT THANKSGIVING

The Lord be with you. **And also with you.**Lift up your hearts. **We lift them to the Lord.**Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. **It is right to give our thanks and praise.**

We give you thanks, O God, through your beloved Servant, Jesus Christ, whom you have sent in these last times as Savior and redeemer, and messenger of your will. He is your Word, inseparable from you, through whom you made all things and in whom you take delight. You sent him from heaven into the Virgin's womb, where he was conceived, and took flesh. Born of the Virgin by the power of the Holy Spirit, he was revealed as your Son.

In fulfillment of your will he stretched out his hands in suffering to release from suffering those who place their trust in you, and so won for you a holy people.

He freely accepted the death to which he was handed over, in order to destroy death and to shatter the chains of the evil one; to trample underfoot the powers of hell and to lead the righteous into light; to fix the boundaries of death and to manifest the resurrection.

And so he took bread, gave thanks to you, and said: "Take, and eat; this is my body, broken for you." In the same way he took the cup, saying: "This is my blood, shed for you. When you do this, do it for the

remembrance of me."

Remembering therefore his death and resurrection, we set before you this bread and cup, thankful that you have counted us worthy to stand in your presence and serve you as your priestly people.

We ask you to send your Holy Spirit upon the offering of the holy church. Gather into one all who share these holy mysteries, filling them with the Holy Spirit and confirming their faith in the truth, that together we may praise you and give you glory, through your Servant, Jesus Christ.

Through him all glory and honor are yours, almighty Father, with the Holy Spirit in the holy church, now and forever. **Amen.**

Holy God, we thank you for Jesus Christ, your Son. In Jesus, born of Mary, your Word became flesh and dwelt among us, full of grace and truth. He lived as one of us, knowing joy and sorrow. Summer Session Highlights

There's been a lot of positive movement over the summer! We've made significant strides in various areas, from supporting the community to enhancing church facilities and tech infrastructure. Here's a quick breakdown of the highlights that have been approved by Session and have been completed or are in process:

- 1.) Community Support: UPC raised \$1320 for school supplies for the Charles Drew School and Early Childhood Center. A group from UPC and Calvary Baptist welcomed them on the first day of school -- building community ties and making a difference for the children in our community.
- 2.) Improved Communication: There's a new wallboard and mobile board in the Fellowship Room which should make sharing information and updates much easier and more effective.
- 3.) Student Outreach: The welcoming bags for university students are being distributed and the first University & Friends luncheon has been a thoughtful touch, making them feel supported by their church family.
- 4.) Sanctuary Upgrade: The upgrades to the front doors, pillars, façade, and landscaping are being worked on- making a big difference in first impressions and overall aesthetics.
- 5.) Digital Sign: Work is being done to install a new digital sign in front of the church- A great tool for announcements, events, and keeping everyone informed.
- 6.) Website Revamp: A new website design is almost ready to unveil- it will be a huge plus in improving your online presence and making it more user-friendly.
- 7.) Office Upgrades: The new equipment (laptop, PC, printer, etc.) will surely streamline office operations. A fresh coat of paint for the minister's office- a welcoming touch for our new minister!
- 8.) Tech Enhancements: The WiFi has been upgraded and digital phones and fiber optic wiring have been installed- a major step forward in making everything more efficient and connected. WiFi is secured throughout the building!
- 9.) Vision Input: Feedback has been gathered from the congregation about UPC's Unifying Vision and will be presented to Session and UPC within the month -- essential to the church's growth and direction.
