Quilts of Valor

Quilts of Valor is a national quilting organization, which makes patriotic quilts for Veterans. There are specific guidelines for these quilts, so please contact the area coordinator, *Kim Price*, if you want to make a quilt top for them. Members of this group meet on Mondays on the 2nd floor of the Anderson City Community Building located next to Meals on Wheels around the corner from the Jo Brown Senior Center where PFQG meets. Quilts of Valor signage over the door will guide you. Please contact Kim at 864-328-8113 for the phone number to call when you arrive for entry as the door is kept locked. When quilts are completed, a ceremony is held "wrapping" the recipients to show our appreciation and admiration.

Upstate Heritage Quilt Trial (UHQT)

The UHQT is devoted to preserving and celebrating the art and history of quilts. Covering Anderson, Oconee and Pickens counties, the UHQT quilts are painted on aluminum signboard varying in size from 1' X 1' up to 8' X 8'. Each painted block is commissioned based on an actual fabric quilt. The Anderson team paints most Friday mornings from 9:30 until noon at the Carnegie Building of the Anderson Arts Center on North Main Street (across from Kitchen Emporium). Philanthropy

Our guild is extremely fortunate to have access to a house in Anderson for quilting on midarm, storing quilt show materials and amazing fabric to use for projects. "Open House" every 1st, 3rd and 4th Wednesday from 9:30 a.m. - Noon. The home is called the "**Sew Inn**" and is owned and managed by *Stamie Cline* who is the philanthropy coordinator for both Prickly Fingers and our sister guild in Anderson, the Electric City Quilters Guild.

The Sew Inn is located at 3010 Manchester Street in Anderson - a block north of Whitehall Elementary. Philanthropy efforts are delivered to a variety of organizations in need.

History of the Guild and Overview

Prickly Fingers Quilt Guild will celebrate its 35th anniversary next March 2026. The Anderson Library has agreed to focus on this anniversary with a display in the library window this coming April. If you are interested in assisting, please contact *Lou Ann Martin*.

There have been many past presidents of our guild, several continue to be active members. Our guild is bound by a set of by-laws, which have been updated over the years. *Ola Coombs*, a former president, was instrumental in formalizing Prickly Fingers back in the early 1990's.

Annual dues are \$20 and are due at the March meeting. You can also buy a door prize ticket when you sign in to meetings. Tickets are \$1 each or 6 for \$5. In addition to meetings and philanthropy, members of both guilds hold a quilt show every-other-year to raise funds and to acknowledge winning quilts in many categories. The next Anderson Area Quilt Show is August 2026 at the Anderson County Civic Center.

The guild also arranges for guest speakers, trunk shows and workshops to help our members improve their quilting skills. All new members are encouraged to sign up for a workshop early on in your membership. It's a great way to learn helpful techniques and make new friends.

The December meeting is dedicated to a Christmas party and potluck brunch. Some members elect to exchange gifts and play games for door prizes.
