INFORMATION FROM Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC)....

New citizenship rules for Canadians born or adopted abroad are now in effect.

The Government of Canada is committed to making Canadian citizenship law fair, clear and reflective of how Canadian families live today, both in and outside Canada. Bill C-3, An Act to Amend the Citizenship Act (2025), is in effect as of today. Moving forward, people born before December 15, 2025, who would have been citizens if not for the first-generation limit or other outdated rules, will be Canadian and can now apply for proof of citizenship.

Meet *Rushni Christian*

Nurse - Saskatchewan Health Authority (Yorkton)



Roshni Christian is a proud newcomer, devoted mother, and committed Nurse living in Yorkton SK. Her journey to Canada is one shaped by courage, sacrifice, and a resolute belief in building a better future for her family.

Originally from India, Roshni made one of the most difficult decisions a parent can face, leaving her young daughter behind in order to pursue education and stability in the UK. That choice, though rooted in love, led to years of separation, emotional hardship, and uncertainty. In 2021, Roshni shared her powerful experience in a CBC First Person article, giving voice to the often unseen struggles of immigrant parents and the emotional cost of starting over in a new country.

Despite the challenges, Roshni continued to move forward with hope and determination. "After much research, I decided our future lay in Canada. I came here on a student visa, again making the sacrifice to leave my daughter until I could sponsor her to join me.

I studied to become a Continuing Care Assistant and found work at a group home for adults with cognitive disabilities. Today I'm a proud nurse and mama after reuniting with my daughter after many years."

"To those who are new to Canada you are not alone. The journey may feel isolating at times, and the sacrifices you make may go unseen, but they matter." Roshni's story is a reminder that growth often begins in moments of uncertainty, and that perseverance can turn even the hardest beginnings into meaningful new chapters.


