Changes to border measures



The Government of Canada announced that effective April 1, 2022, fully vaccinated travellers will no longer need to provide a pre-entry COVID-19 test result to enter Canada by air, land or water. As a reminder, travellers arriving to Canada from any country, who qualify as fully vaccinated, may need to take a COVID-19 molecular test on arrival if selected for mandatory random testing. Travellers selected for mandatory random

testing are not required to quarantine while awaiting their test result. For partially or unvaccinated travelers who are currently allowed to travel to Canada, pre-entry testing requirements are not changing. Learn more HERE.

FUN Fact about Canada!

Canada is as tall as it is wide, creating a wide range of climate conditions. Canada has the largest latitude range of any country on the planet. Our southern border lies at the same latitude as northern



California, while our northern edge reaches right to the top of the world. It's rarely the same season in the same place at the same time. In early April, the Arctic may still be in the throes of a frigid winter, while the south can experience summer-like temperatures. No doubt, our weather forecasters are the busiest in the world!



Why the Easter Bunny?

The Easter Bunny (also called the Easter Rabbit or Easter Hare) is a folkloric figure and **symbol of Easter**, depicted as a rabbit bringing Easter eggs. Originating among German Lutherans, the "Easter Hare" originally played the role of a judge, evaluating whether children were good or disobedient in behavior at the start of the season of Eastertide, similar to the "naughty or nice" list made by Santa Claus As part of the legend, the creature carries


colored eggs in its basket, as well as candy,



and sometimes toys, to the homes of children. As such, the Easter Bunny again shows similarities to Santa (or the Christkind) and Christmas by bringing gifts to children on the night before a holiday. The custom was first mentioned in Georg Franck von Franckenau's *De ovis paschalibus* ('About Easter eggs') in 1682, referring to a German tradition of an Easter Hare bringing eggs for the children. *Source: Wikipedia*
