Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada News

Beginning July 26, 2021 individuals who applied for the recently opened pathway to permanent residence will be eligible for a new open work permit while awaiting the results of their application. This is a one-time open work permit, valid until December 31, 2022. An applicant's spouse or common-law partner and dependent children 18 years or older may also be eligible to apply for an open work permit under this policy. Applications for the new permit should be submitted online. Further details on how to apply will be added to IRCC's website on July 26, 2021. To learn more click HERE.

FUN Fact about Canada!

Canada is well known for its' cold winters, but it has been one hot summer so far! The previous record high temperature in Canada was 45 C, set in Saskatchewan in July 1937. According to Environment Canada, a new record was set in

Lytton, British Columbia on June 27th, 2021 where a temperature of 46.6 C was recorded. Lytton BC now holds the record for Canada's all time maximum high. The coldest temperature ever recorded is -63 C in Snaq, Yukon. That's quite the temperature range!
