Canada welcomes the most immigrants in a single year in its history

The story of immigration fills many chapters in the history of Canada—including the most recent one. To support Canada's post-pandemic recovery and chart a more prosperous future, the Government of Canada set a target of welcoming 401,000 new permanent residents in 2021, as part of the 2021–2023 Immigration Levels Plan. The Honourable Sean Fraser, Minister of Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship, announced on December 23rd, 2021 that Canada had reached its target and welcomed more than 401,000 new permanent residents in 2021. Surpassing the previous record from 1913, this is the most newcomers in a year in Canadian history.

FUN Fact about Canada!

Get the shovels ready! The greatest single-day snowfall recorded in Canada was on February 11, 1999, when Tahtsa, British Columbia, was blanketed with nearly a metre and a half (145cm) of the white stuff in ONE DAY! That's about 56 inches or 4.7 feet of snow in 24 hours! And here we thought we had some pretty large snowfalls this winter!

March 11th, 2022 at 7pm - SWIS Students in grades 9 to 12.




