# Government of Canada announces additional travel measures to contain the spread of Omicron variant

In response to the significant risks and uncertainties presented by the spread of the Omicron variant in Canada and globally, on December 17<sup>th</sup> the Minister of Health, the Honourable Jean-Yves Duclos announced further adjustments to travel and border measures.
