Free replacement documents and measures for people affected by the 2024 wildfire season

Last year, Canada experienced the worst wildfire season on record, which threatened the health, safety and economic stability of people in Canada and their communities. personally would like to thank the Directors for their continued guidance and support to what ECNWCI set out to achieve which is to provide clients inclusive and client centred services with respect, and compassion.




