Immigration, Refugees, and Citizenship Canada (IRCC)

To support Canada's economic growth and help address labour market shortages, we're making some changes:

- We will end the pause on Express Entry draws and resume inviting qualified candidates to apply for permanent residence in July.
- Starting in mid-June, former international students in Canada whose post-graduation work permits expired or are expiring between Jan 31, 2022 and Dec 31, 2022, will be able to get an additional open work permit of up to 18 months duration.
- New measures for temporary resident to permanent resident pathway applicants will take effect in June, including: longer duration open work permits (OWP) and OWP eligibility for immediate family members outside of Canada who were included in the PR application These changes will help ensure Canadian employers have the workers they need to address shortages and grow Canada's labour force. Canada has six times more oil than Russia It's thick, it's sticky and Canada has an estimated 176.8 billion recoverable barrels of it. That's right, crude bitumen—a semi-solid source of petroleum—is available in abundance

in Canada's oil sands.
There's an estimated 249.67
billion accessible barrels of
the black stuff in the world
and Canada has about 70.8
per cent of it—four times
more than Kazakhstan and
six times more than Russia.

Meet Oksana Hemm

Oksana moved to Canada on November 18, 2007 with her younger brother Vasyl, who was 17 at the time and she was 24. Their parents moved to Yorkton earlier under the SINP program in September 2007 and started working at Harvest meats. The family decided to move to Canada because Canada has the 3rd largest Ukrainian population in the world.



"We moved from the beautiful city Ternopil, which is known for its architectural and cultural monuments. Ternopil has something for everyone – an idyllic town center with two effusive fountains, small cobbled boulevards lined with a profusion of colored flowers, a few book stalls and a variety of cafes and restaurants.

I've been living in Yorkton since November 2007 and now I call this my second home. The place where I met my husband and where we're raising our family. I've worked in settlement services since May 2011, first as a Newcomer Liaison Worker with Partners in Settlement and Integration with Sask Abilities and then from January 2014 until present as a Settlement Worker. In January 2018, we switched over from Partners in Settlement and Integration and are now East Central Newcomer Welcome Centre Inc. What I like about Canada and Saskatchewan is there are extremely friendly and helpful people and government programs which helps and support the needs of people. Yorkton Saskatchewan has been our home for almost 14 years and I really appreciate to call Yorkton my home." - Oksana
