

Gospel Reflection for the Twenty First Sunday of Ordinary Time **No Meal Tickets**

How do you imagine the gates of Heaven? Perhaps you imagine a fine set of pearly gates and a welcome committee flanked by all of the relatives who have gone before. Perhaps Saint Peter will be there, and a couple of harp-playing cherubs. Imagine instead a narrow door heavily locked and bolted! Imagine knocking on the door only to be told, "I do not know where you come from," and to be turned away. It wouldn't matter how much we insisted that we were baptised and regular churchgoers, our pleas would be ignored.

So where are we coming from? We're baptised as Christians and we know what we're supposed to be doing, but is that enough? God of course isn't making it difficult on purpose for us to be with him in Heaven. God loves us and wants us to be with him, but he doesn't want us to become complacent. The last thing that God wants is for us to feel that because we are baptised Christians, we have some sort of meal ticket into Heaven. The last thing we should do is opt for comfort over commitment or self-indulgence over self-sacrifice. Life is a testing ground in which we should be continually striving to be better. We should never think that we have achieved all that is expected of us just because we go to church and give to charity now and then.

However well we think we are doing we could be unpleasantly surprised to find ourselves at the back of Heaven's queue when we fondly imagined we might be somewhere near the front.

Gospel Reflection for the Twenty Second Sunday of Ordinary Time God's Seating Plan

How do we define 'humility? What is our perception of a humble person? Perhaps our idea of a humble person is someone self-effacing, someone who never pushes themselves forward or blows their own trumpet, somebody who is overly modest. In a society where we need to push ourselves forward to succeed, 'humility isn't a quality we value. In fact, we often consider the 'humble person' as a bit of a doormat. Fortunately this isn't Jesus' perception of humility and he certainly isn't asking us to behave like doormats?

Today Jesus uses an invitation to a dinner party to give a lesson in humility. Jesus notices that the guests at the dinner party seat themselves in positions of honour at the table. It's clear that some of Jesus' fellow guests are so puffed up with pride that they assume the top places at the table. Jesus tells them that things will be just the opposite in God's Kingdom. "For all who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted.

Despite our preconceptions humility isn't about being a doormat. True humility isn't about thinking less of ourselves but thinking of others more. True humility is about serving others without expecting anything in return. True humility is not about seeking to rub shoulders with the rich and influential, but rubbing shoulders with everyone whether they are a king or a pauper. Humility is about sharing time and money unconditionally without expecting repayment, admiration, accolades or long letters of thanks. When we approach God's table, we must remember to be first to put others first.

Cathedral150 Appeal

Canon James McAuley VG, Dean of St John's Cathedral writes.....

In 2032, the cathedral and the diocese will mark their 150th anniversary. As the seat of the bishop, the cathedral is the liturgical and theological "heart" of the diocese. Recent inspections by a conservation architect and other specialists have identified work which needs to be done to the cathedral's roofs,



upper nave windows, organ, heating and electrical systems. This will cost more than £2 million. Funds permitting, we hope also to develop the site to make it more fit for mission and outreach in the most socially deprived part of our diocese. The Cathedral150 appeal will be launched in Advent 2025.
