21st July 2024: Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time - Year B



The younger generation are very good at telling us to "take a chill pill...." and there's nothing more infuriating. But funnily enough, "taking a chill pill" is something we're extraordinarily bad at. We are surrounded by twenty first century devices to save us time, such as emails, microwaves and disposable nappies, yet somehow we don't end up with hours of free time as a result. Quite the contrary, we work faster, travel faster, eat faster and take on more and more work. We feel that we need to fill every waking moment with an extra job. Yet sitting still for a moment in silence and solitude whilst the world rushes around us is very important.

Today Jesus understands that his disciples are exhausted by the demands of the crowds and suggests escaping by boat to find a quiet place to rest, recharge and presumably take stock. Unfortunately, the crowds worked out where Jesus was off to and beat him to it. Jesus stepped out of the boat to be greeted by the same crowds he had just left behind. If Jesus felt any exasperation he didn't show it. Moved by compassion, because the people are like 'sheep without a shepherd' Jesus sets about putting their needs before his own. It might appear that Jesus was just about as bad at 'taking a chill pill' as the rest of us, but the story simply points to his level of compassion and discernment.

Taking time out to recharge and take stock is often more important than fitting in that extra job. Have you ever got to the end of a very busy day and wondered what you have actually achieved? How much worse to get to the end of one's life and realise that we have achieved little of real importance. Take a chill pill. Remember to retreat from the world from time to time. Remember to regularly ask yourself those all-important life-enhancing questions.

A note to the Parish from the Chair of the Parish Finance Committee

You haven't had financial information for over two years so I'm writing with an update on where our Parish finances stand. The delay has been partly due to changes in our accounting systems as well as the change of the old Diocesan Trust to a 21st century Charitable Incorporated Organisation. In addition, we have refreshed the Committee adding Julia Braithwaite and Simon Spilsbury to the existing team of Canon Simon, Jeremy Best, George Ennis, Sue Nind and myself.

You have continued to be a generous Parish despite the pandemic and more recently the "cost of living crisis". As a result, our finances remain in good order and we are one of the best funded Parishes in the Diocese.

More specifically:-

SVP

- \Diamond Your giving has continued at c £120k annually \Diamond
 - Our costs have stayed broadly the same and in percentage terms are:-
 - Clergy and staff 31%
 - Church 14%
 - Office, Presbytery and grounds 15%
 - Diocese 27%
 - General 13%
- \Diamond We continue to record an annual surplus
- \Diamond Since our year end in August 2021 our bank balances have risen from £250k to c£310k.

The stained glass windows for the East side of the church are fully funded with no Parish funds being required.

We are now in the process of receiving that part of your generous giving to the "Closer to Christ" campaign that will return c£80k to the Parish over 5 years.

In 2022 the Parish assets were subject to a professional Quinquennial inspection which has identified repairs across the estate. At present we are in the process of devising, pricing and assembling a programme of works with a professional surveyor, which will need to be agreed with the Diocese as it now oversees all significant non-routine spending. The likely numbers involved are c£150k over the next three years, on a whole range of small renovations and repair projects reflecting the need to reinstate the fabric of the estate. I will report more fully in late October after the year end accounts are prepared and reviewed by the Diocese. In the meantime, if you have any specific questions please contact me via the Parish Office.

In conclusion, we continue to operate as a standalone Parish, while working more closely with our sister Parishes in Bracknell and Crowthorne/Sandhurst (both in good financial standing), using our robust finances to now repair and improve the fabric of our estate and support any new projects the Parish may decide will help us deliver the Mission of the Church in Wokingham.
