17th October 2021: Twenty-Ninth Sunday of Ordinary Time - Year B



How do we equate success? Is success a career in management perhaps or a titled role? Do we see success as rising to the top of our chosen field and earning recognition fame and respect with a healthy wage packet thrown in for good measure?

Today we find James and John not behaving as good disciples ought. They ask Jesus for places of honour in heaven's seating

arrangements. How could they have followed Jesus for as long as they had and yet fail to understand that he was not about status or power?

James and John were amongst Jesus' closest friends so perhaps they could have been forgiven for getting their wires crossed. Their ministry was important. More than important, their role was key to changing history. But somewhere along the line, the importance of their mission and 'self-importance' had blurred and James and John were left with a desire for acclaim and prestige. Jesus had to gently point out that as Christians, these are never things we should seek. If we find ourselves in positions of importance we have to take the opportunity to work for a common good. If we find ourselves with influence we need to use that influence to set a good example or to motivate others. If we are entrusted with leadership, we need to lead by rolling up our sleeves and serving others. The world needs do-ers not theorists. Who wants to be led by someone intent on throwing their weight around?

Today's challenge is to serve with no expectation of return; to give with no expectation of recognition or influence. The challenge is to become the person God wants us to be, not necessarily the person we want to be.

One World Week 2021 18th – 24th October

The Theme for OWW 2021 is: "Act Now For Our Children's World" One World Week occurs just before the COP26 United Nations Climate Summit, which is taking place in Glasgow in November 2021, (postponed from 2020). Britain is hosting this Conference which will be attended by national leaders and delegations from



around the world. The aim is to build on the 2015 Paris Agreement with more ambitious commitments and measures to reduce carbon emissions and stop further climate change - so that all our children and future generations can enjoy a future in a sustainable world. The children themselves, inspired by Greta Thunberg, understand the urgency and have been pressing the adults to get on with it!

To do:-

Become a supermarket missionary. In the weekly shop try to make choices that reflect our Christian concern for the planet and for third world countries. Try to buy seasonal locally grown foods over foods that have travelled hundreds of air miles.



St Luke - 18th October

Luke wrote as a Gentile for Gentile Christians, and this gives his Gospel a distinctive slant. Material found in Luke's Gospel and not elsewhere includes much of the account of Our Lord's birth and infancy and boyhood, and some of the most moving parables, such as that of the Good Samaritan and that of the Prodigal Son.

In Luke's account of the Gospel, we find an emphasis on the human love of Christ, on His compassion for sinners and for suffering and unhappy persons, for outcasts such as the Samaritans, tax collectors, lepers, shepherds (not a respected profession), and for the poor. The role of women in Christ's ministry is more emphasized in Luke than in the other Gospel writings.
