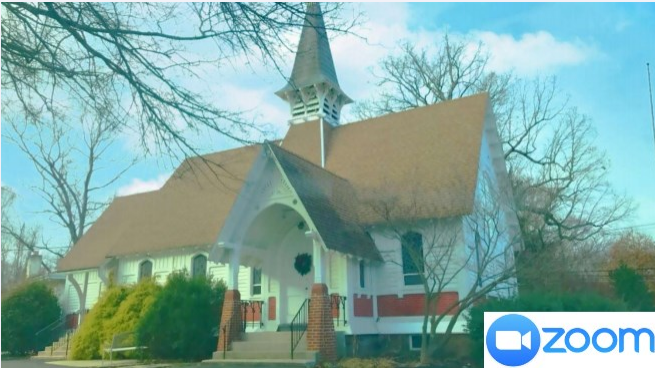




reetings Everyone —



Today is Sunday, August 16. The 20th Sunday in ordinary time and the 11th Sunday after Pentecost. We are planning for a joyful day. We are initiating our first online live virtual service that will stream on the internet beginning at 9:00 AM.

We see the implementation of the virtual service as a necessary first step to the eventual return of live in person worship. When that day comes we will still need to provide the virtual option for everyone who still wishes to stay socially distant or are unable to attend in person for any reason. We also have to be able to accommodate overflow capacity when we re-open for in person

worship. When that time comes we will be limited by the State of NJ to 25% of legal capacity. The team has been working hard to make these accommodations and to maximize our capacity. Wi-Fi has been extended into the sanctuary, and entrance doors have been taken down and rehung to open outwards instead of inwards as directed by the Fire Marshall. There are still a number of steps to be taken before in person worship can commence. These include the installation of lighted EXIT signs above each doorway. Measurements and rearrangement of the pews for social distancing, and plethora of paperwork that requires Presbytery approval.

That all is in progress and will come in time, so for now let us embrace and focus on the virtual services that are before us. We had a successful technical rehearsal Wednesday evening as we ironed out the order of worship, equipment, placement of the camera, microphone, sound level, and internet connection. Then on Saturday, Phil kept the Zoom meeting up all day so everyone could practice connecting into the service and be ready for Sunday morning.

- When you are connected into the service your microphone will be muted by the moderator and only the Church audio will be open. This will keep our communication clear and we will avoid the scenario from Genesis 11 and the Tower of Babel.
- During the announcement section of our service we will ask for any prayer requests. To submit your prayer request into the Zoom meeting, simply type it into the Chat function of the application, and we will collect them all for the Pastor to offer up at the appropriate time. Helpful Hint: Type up your request ahead of time and then copy and paste it into the Chat window. You may also email your request ahead of time to RickCheslo@Gmail.com to submit them ahead of the service.

Bustleton's Best — Church Cookbook Recipes of the Week

This week's recipe is simple and it provides a delicious side of potatoes when you are grilling or camping. It also lends itself to infinite versatility of your imagination. I have made variations using this method of cooking in foil on Cub Scout camping trips. We gave the boys some foil with a small chicken breast, allowed them to toss in a spoonful of the onion soup mix, and a few other ingredients, and set them over the fire. Voila. 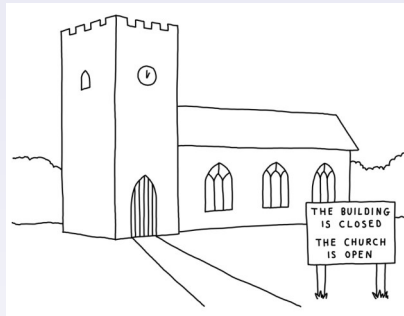
Potato Bacon & Onion Foil Packages for Grill

Ginny Heal

- 2-3 sheets of heavy duty foil
- 1 package of dry onion soup mix
- 10-12 small red potatoes
- 12 slices crumbled bacon
- 1 small onion diced

- 1C Cheese
- 3 T Butter
- Salt & pepper to taste
- Sour cream for serving

Spray each sheet of foil with cooking oil. Place equal portions of potatoes, bacon, soup mix and mix together. Add salt & pepper and cheese. Add 1 tablespoon butter on top. Wrap securely. Grill for 25-30 minutes or cook in oven at 350 for 35 min. Let them sit for about 10 minutes and serve with sour cream.

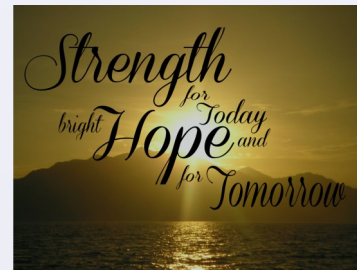
