
Thought for Todal

Bustleton's Best — Church Cookbook Recipe of the Week

Bill is no longer with us, but his spirit lives on with everyone who has ever called Providence Presbyterian home. If anyone would like to memorialize someone here. Bill's Chili (crockpot)

1 lb. ground beef

1 lb sausage

1 medium onion, diced

1 bell pepper, diced

2 C celery, chopped

2 (28 oz) cans diced tomatoes

1 (28 oz) can whole, peeled tomatoes

Pinch ground cumin

1 (14 oz) can pinto beans, drained &

1 (14 oz) can black beans, drained &

rinsed

rinsed

1 (14 oz) can kidney beans, drained &

rinsed

1 pkg. Chili seasoning mix

Shredded cheddar, sour cream,

chopped scallions, for

Garnish

In skillet brown beef & sausage, drain & set aside. Saute briefly the onion, pepper, celery until tender. To crockpot add browned meat, veggies, tomatoes, beans and seasoning. Cook on low for approx 4 hours. Serve with cheese, sour cream and green onions

The following is an article from the <u>Burlington Gazzette</u>, Saturday, December 21, 1878 which recognized immediately the churches prominence:

Bustleton's New Church

"The village of Bustleton was all bustle last Tuesday, in consequence of the service attendent upon the dedication of the Providence Presbyterian Church. During the past ten days, as a subject of conversation, the weather has had a rest, in that vicinity, and wherever two or three were seen together, the coming dedication was certain to be the absorbing topic. The people of the village and the surrounding country are proud of their new church, and they have reason to be so. The existance of a church in a community speaks well for the inhabitants thereof.

the construction of the building 93 loads of stone were hauled and used; 11 of brick; 4 of lime; 50 of lumber; 29 of sand; 29 hogsheads of water and a great quantity of gravel. This hauling was done by the following named gentleman, Hillman D. Warren deserving special mention for having hauled more loads than anyone else.
