Express Appreciation to the People You Love



Your gift to your loved ones is also a gift to yourself. Notice how good it feels to express your appreciation.




At the end of the day, we all just want to feel valued and appreciated, seen for who we are, and loved. Give the gift of love and appreciation, and it will come back to you.



Fifty six years later, I am convicted by a simple question. If I truly believe in and spend time with God, where are the discernable changes? How can I say I have a relationship with Him and not be full of joy? How can I profess to be a follower and leave my cross daily at will/call? Why do I more often than not get the deny yourself and reach out to others command backward?

These are questions on which to reflect and pray about daily. Human nature is a strong, constant force to overcome and free will is too often self-satisfying. Sautéed Brussels Sprouts

"Brussels sprouts are one of the many foods that I hated when I was a kid and I love now. The best bacon I've ever eaten comes from Szucs' Meat Market, 270 Alden Ave in Roebling, New Jersey.

| 1 lb. Brussels sprouts | ½ C chicken stock |
| 2 slices of bacon | 2 T grated parmesan cheese |
| 2 T finely diced mild onion | 1 T butter |

In a saucepan of boiling, salted water, cook sprouts until almost tender, 3 to 4 minutes. Drain and slice sprouts in halves and set aside. In a medium sauté pan fry bacon until crisp. Remove bacon and dice into bacon bits. To the rendered bacon fat, add the onion and sauté until onion is transparent. Add the chicken stock and simmer until the liquid is reduced by half then mix in the parmesan cheese. Add the butter to finish the pan sauce. Pour pan sauce over Brussels sprouts. Salt and pepper to taste. Garnish with bacon bits and parsley.






