

Bustleton's Best — Church Cookbook Recipe of the Week

I received a weather alert this afternoon for an overnight Frost Advisory. Since the frost will be on the pumpkin, now is the perfect time to start perfecting our pumpkin recipes to enjoy on crisp autumn days. Let's us begin with Margo's Pumpkin Bread. I can taste it now still warm from the oven with a light spread of butter on it and a cup of coffee. Thanks Margo!

Pumpkin Bread

1/3 C melted butter

1 2/3 C sifted flour 1/4 t baking powder

½ t vanilla 2 eggs

1 t baking soda 3/4 t salt (optional)

1 C pumpkin 1/3 C of water

1/2 t each cinnamon / nutmeg

1 1/3 C sugar

½ C of chopped nuts

Mix together the first five (dry) ingredients. Mix together sugar butter and vanilla and combine with dry mixture. Add the eggs 1 at a time beating well. Stir in 1 cup pumpkin and water. Stir only until smooth, don't over beat. Fold in the chopped nuts. Fold into greased and floured loaf pan. Bake at 350 for 60 minutes, check with toothpick, if it does not come out clean bake 10 minutes more or until toothpick comes out clean. One batch makes 3 little loafs of bread.


I only ask




