Come Together Right Now Under Him

I was just easing back in my reading chair pondering the insurrection this past Monday. Now you're thinking to yourself it appears that Randy is a bit off, after all the uprising in Washington happened back on January 6th. Well as far as my being "a bit off," Barbara has been well aware of that fact for over 31 years. She has accepted the burden and soldiered on. However, the insurgence I'm talking about is the Snowflake Insurrection on February 1st. After all, each snowflake is but a single ice crystal falling to earth. It's when they join together en masse that they make a difference. First comes the formation of the flake, then the joining together in common purpose, and then the impact is felt. Lord knows I spent the better part of Monday afternoon and Tuesday morning dealing with that impact. 


