





Next weekend Jon will be competing for a chance to earn additional scholarship money in the second part of the competition where everyone will prepare Chicken Dijonaise with a Sauce Supreme. CHOCOLATE CAKE

INGREDIENTS

2 cups buttermilk

2 large eggs

2 cups suga

2-1/2 cups all-purpose flour

1-3/4 tsp. baking soda

1/2 cup cocoa powder

4 tbsp. unsalted butter, melted

PREPARATION

Spray the cake pans with non-stick spray. Preheat the oven to 375 degrees.

NOTE: Follow the directions EXACTLY. Do not deviate. Use a hand whisk to mix.

- Mix the buttermilk, sugar and eggs together briefly to break up the eggs and blend.
- Sift together the flour, salt, baking soda, and cocoa powder. Mix into the liquid until combined. DO NOT OVERMIX.
- 3. Stir in the melted butter.

- 4. Scale equal amounts into the 3 pans.
- Bake at 375 degrees until the cake springs back or a toothpick inserted into the cake comes out clean.




The West Jersey Presbytery is introducing an opportunity for contemplative fellowship that is titled "Vital Vigils."
