Comfort is like a favorite blanket on a cold night. It surrounds and warms us emotionally while protecting us from the chill of loss, grief, disappointments, and hurt.

Through the years of life's ups and downs, grandparents have drawn upon God's being there in mercy and comfort to help them make it through the tough spots. They have discovered that when they need hope, God provides glimpses of assurance' when they need strength, God fills them with his own; and when they need a person to come near and help, the family of God is there for them, sharing God's tender words, reassuring hope, and unfailing

love.

Grandparents are repositories of compassion. When a young, inexperienced traveler on life's highway breaks down, grandfather or grandmother can be there with a practical word of advice, a supportive listening ear, and a look or hug that says, *God and I are here to comfort and help you make it through*.

As life's seasons change, grandparents decide whether to become critics or comforters, takers ore givers, escapers or encouragers.

I know about being there. When you've passed through trials, I've always been right there. I haveen't let the storms of life overwhelm Or drown you. I've protected you from the Burn of the flames.


