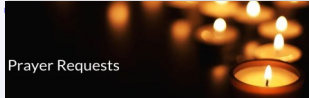

Rev. Stephen P. Fritz – is still an active minister today with his wife Meg. His parish is Wayside Presbyterian Church in Landisville, Pennsylvania. While he was minister of the Providence Presbyterian Church of Bustleton, he lived in the manse with his wife and 3 children. Our church family then consisted of 125 members and 60 non members and about 60 children (which was once at 125 strong). A lot of events were held: dinners, colonial times enactment, fishing tournaments, children putting on plays, Sunday School, Christmas plays, social gatherings, flower planting around the church and Christian Education building, church picnics, and a few bus trips. Everyone seemed to be involved. During his tenure the old church, which was later the social and meeting hall, was torn down. Kenneth Poole can remember as a youngster going to his Boy Scout meetings and dances held at the social hall. Can some of you remember times spent there? Also the elevator for the church was installed, 1995. The first person to ride the elevator was Anna Parks. Rev. Stephen P. Fritz served our church from 1989 to 1996.
