

The 26 Second Sermon

Address. It is
recognized as
one of
history's
greatest
speeches, yet
it contains a

mere 272 words. Greatness isn't necessarily measured by size. True greatness is found in content and character. In overlooking the seemingly ordinary, you just might miss the extraordinary.

We can quickly call to mind the handful of outsized characters of the Bible and their exploits: Moses and the Red Sea, David and Goliath, the lives of Peter and Paul. But there are many more ordinary folks who moved the Biblical narrative forward by their simple lives and action outside the spotlight: the widow at Zarephath, the woman at the well, the lame man at Bethesda, the faith of the Roman centurion. For every major prophet, there were three minor prophets. For every cathedral, there are many simple country churches.

Which brings me to the 26 second sermon. It was given last Sunday afternoon in our church. Were you there and did you witness it? If not cue up the video of the ordination & installation from this Sunday passed. Then fast forward to the 1 hour 34 minute 45 second mark. Now focus in on the next 26 seconds. It will serve as the best 26 second sermon you will ever see. Pastor Inna steps up in the pulpit for the first time in the entire service. She has been preceded by folks reading and praying, by clergy speaking and sermonizing.

She looks out over the congregation and simply says, "I need to thank my Lord and Savior first of all." She then turns to her left, takes hold of the cross on the wall, and spends some time in quiet contemplation. A whole lot of words came out of that pulpit during the ceremony, but for this watching pilgrim, nothing that came before had the impact those precious 26 seconds provided.

At that moment I witnessed a simple woman crack open the alabaster jar of her life. She worshipped her Lord in thankful recognition of his saving, guiding hand in her life. In that moment, that wonderful, spontaneous, teaching moment, she bathed herself in her Savior's presence. She opened a window to the spiritual relationship she has cultivated over many years of travel on rough and challenging terrain. It was Inna and her God. Those present were just blessed bystanders to this miracle of faith. As I watched in wonder, my only thought was a paraphrase of John the Baptist, "I am not fit to untie her shoes."


