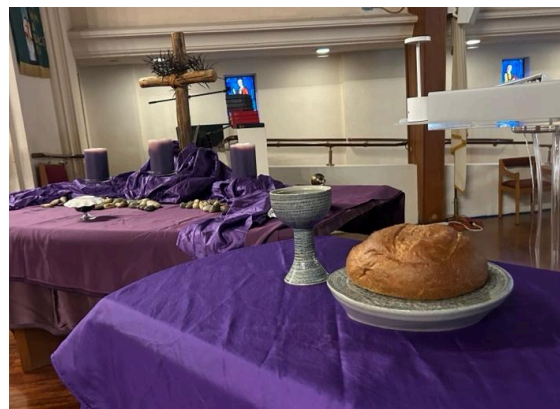
“See, I am making all things new.” (Revelation 21:5)

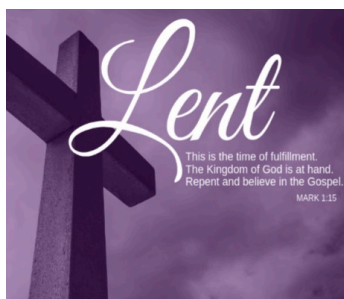

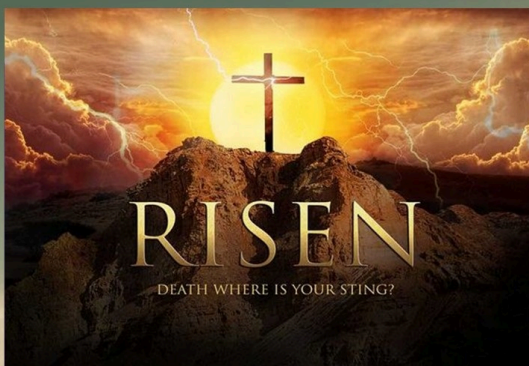

The Progressive Christianity Book class has been reading a book called The Great Spiritual Migration by Brian McLaren. We were reading a passage that we thought was so helpful, we wanted to share it with the whole church. The section of the book was talking about what love looks like in families. What skills are needed to show love. Here is the passage:

These skills include common courtesies, gratitude, admitting weaknesses and failures, self-reporting emotions, expressing hurt or disappointment, confronting and forgiving, asking for help, differing graciously, surfacing and negotiating competing desires, taking the first step to resolve conflicts, upholding wise boundaries, saying yes and no, winning and losing graciously, creating win-win outcomes, speaking truth in love, speaking truth to power, asking good questions, requesting feedback, expressing affection, opening one's heart, giving gifts, and seeking wise counsel.

Our class felt that many of these expressions are important to show to others in our lives. Our example can become a great teacher.

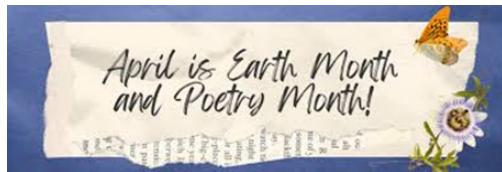
Animal & Environmental Holidays for April 2025

April – Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Month

The American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (ASPCA) created this month in 2006 to raise awareness about the mistreatment that animals often face. Ways to help include reporting animal abuse, buying cage-free eggs, grass-fed beef, and shopping for products with a cruelty-free bunny logo.



April – Poetic Earth Month

Poetic Earth Month was created by Tweetspeak in 2019 to combine both Poetry Month with Earth Month. This month-long celebration focuses on earth care by inspiring people to connect to nature with ways to protect the world around you that is reflected in their poetry, art, and storytelling.



April 10th - National Farm Animal Day

This day focuses on the humane care of farm animals and finding homes for abandoned and abused farm animals. This day raises awareness about the poor living conditions some of these animals face. These animals deserve to be respected and live in humane conditions.



April 13th – Int'l Plant Appreciation Day

A day to appreciate all the plants whether you are a gardener or not. Flowering plants for their beauty, vegetables and fruits to feed us, trees to provide shelter and shade. Plants also support life – they take in carbon dioxide and produce oxygen which is essential to life.



April 16th – Save the Elephants Day

Elephants are the largest land mammal inhabiting areas in Africa and Asia. Sadly, these animals face problems such as poaching for ivory, habitat loss, and human elephant conflict. Ways to honor this day include supporting organizations fighting to help them and not purchasing ivory products.



April 17th – International Bat Appreciation Day

The Bat Conservation International (BCI) created this day in 1982 to raise awareness about the importance of bats for the ecosystems and conservation efforts to protect them and their habitats. There are more than 1,400 bat species in the world, with 47 species in the United States.



April 19th-27th – National Parks Week

An annual celebration of America's National Parks to encourage people to visit and connect with nature. Parks offer spectacular landscapes, diverse ecosystems, and wildlife viewing. Some parks offer outdoor recreation like hiking, camping, and boating. There is a Free Entrance Day on April 19th.



April 22nd – Earth Day

Earth Day is a world wide annual event where people celebrate the earth by promoting awareness for the health of our environment. We all need a healthy planet to thrive, and our planet needs us to take action for nature. This year's theme for Earth Day is "Our Power, Our Planet". Ways to help include using less plastic and saving water.



April 27th – International Crow and Raven Appreciation Day

It is a day to celebrate these amazing intelligent birds. They are known for their intelligence and problem-solving skills. Crows and ravens may look alike but they have a few differences such as their beaks and tail feather shape. There are both ravens and crows in Arizona, but in Tucson it is ravens.



April 26th-May 4th – Stewardship Week

The 70th annual celebration to promote conservation awareness of our natural resources and to support preservation efforts. The 2025 theme is "Home is Where the Habitat Is", where both natural and managed habitats are important in supporting biodiversity and ecological balance in nature.
