Dear families of the First United Methodist Church of Tucson,

I am thankful for your support and prayers that allowed me to take some time off to visit my family in South Korea. I returned last Friday, but I am currently dealing with jet lag. Nonetheless, the precious moments I spent with my family are irreplaceable. As many of you are aware, my father has been battling severe dementia, resulting in the loss of his eyesight and speaking ability due to the side effects of diabetes following a stroke. Since his stroke in December 2022, my mother has been his primary caregiver. During my visit, my mother was overjoyed to spend time together and proud of my achievement in receiving a Doctor of Ministry degree from Garrett-Evangelical Theological Seminary in Evanston, Illinois.

I recently visited my grandmother, who is in a nursing home, to bid her a short farewell before Halla embarks on a journey to explore life in South Korea with my siblings and her cousins. This change will allow me to be more flexible with my busy summer schedule, without worrying about her food and care. This will be the first time I have been alone as a single parent since my husband's passing.

What a journey it has been! I always dreamed of witnessing her growth, but I never imagined that my parents would age and face sickness. How foolish and immature I was! I am reminded of Jesus and how he dealt with his disciples, understanding their foolishness and immaturity. Yet, the love of my parents prevails over me, just as the true and immense love of Jesus Christ prevails over all of us.

I feel incredibly lucky and blessed. You have shown me amazing blessings, love, and care since my move to Tucson, especially as we celebrate my recent move to a new home. How can I complain about my life? Sometimes, I do find myself overwhelmed by schedules and situations, but I am also reminded to be humble and grateful for where I come from - my mother's womb, Jeju Island (my hometown), South Korea (my country of origin), Illinois (my second hometown), and now here in Tucson, AZ.

Philippians 4:13 (NIV) - "I can do all this through him who gives me strength."

This verse reminds us that through our faith and reliance on God, we can find the strength to face any situation, whether it be challenges, blessings, or changes in our lives. It speaks to the idea that with God's help, we can overcome obstacles and find peace and contentment in all circumstances.

If you're interested in coming, please notify the church office or Shirley Murray at (520) 297-4796 by Wednesday so she can reserve enough seats at the restaurant.

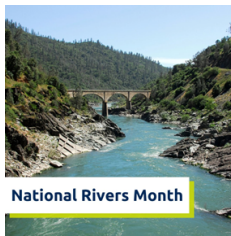
Animal & Environmental Holidays for June 2024

June is National Zoo and Aquarium Month

In 1982, President Ronald Reagan dedicated the month of June to honor and celebrate zoos and aquariums for their conservation, education, and research efforts. This month encourages people to visit their local zoos/aquariums to learn and experience the wildlife/marine life of our planet.



June is also National Rivers Month

Inspired by Canadian conservationist Mark Angelo, this month-long event was first celebrated in 2005. The goal of this month is to protect the Earth's precious commodity of water for future generations. Ways to help include saving water or participating in a river cleanup event.



June 5th – World Environment Day

In 1974 the United Nations General Assembly created this day to raise awareness and action for the protection of the environment. The theme of World Environment Day 2024 is, "Land Restoration, Desertification, and Drought Resilience."



June 6th National Caves and Karst Day

Created in 2017 by the National Caves Association to celebrate the unique ecosystems that can be found underground. Karst landscapes are subterranean limestone formations such as caves, caverns which feature stalagmite/stalactite, underground streams, and sinkholes.



June 11th – World Lynx Day

Created in 2017 by the Transboundary Lynx Project to raise awareness about this medium-sized wild cat. There are four species of lynx in the world with two species found in Europe and Asia, and two species found in North America, known as the Canadian Lynx and Bobcat.



June 16th – Father's Day

Father's Day is celebrated on the third Sunday of June to celebrate all the wonderful fathers (dads). Fathers can come in all shapes and sizes.



June 17th – World Crocodile Day

Created in 2017 by the Crocodile Research Coalition along with the Belize Zoo to raise awareness about the plight of endangered crocodiles, alligators, and gharials in the world. There are three species of crocodylians with over twenty different types.



June 22nd – National Pet Choking Prevention Awareness Day

It was created in 2023 by Bow Wow Labs along with veterinarians with the goal to help prevent avoidable pet choking. Choking can occur with anything that is smaller than the windpipe or back of the throat can get stuck, such as food, chew toys, balls, rawhides, bones, and sticks.



June 24th – Upcycling Day

Upcycling means to repurpose items that are no longer being used. It helps give the item a new purpose and second life. This way they do not go to waste and end up in a landfill. It's a day to celebrate creativity and sustainability.



June 30th – International Asteroid Day

In December 2016, the UN General Assembly declared this day to be a global awareness campaign about the asteroid hazard and the crisis communication actions to be taken if there is a near-Earth object threat. It is a day to remember the Earth's largest asteroid impact on June 30, 1908: the Siberian Tunguska event.
