SOUL KITCHEN

Easy Peasy Chicken-Vegetable Casserole

Ingredients

- Chicken, cut into chunks, fillets, strips, or cubes as you prefer
- Vegetables, assorted: Try butternut squash, carrots, zucchini, onion, frozen green beans, peas, mushrooms, corn, and/or asparagus
- "Cream of" soups: any combination may be used; try onion, potato, chicken, celery, and/or mushroom Seasonings and finely chopped herbs, such as rosemary and thyme Bread crumbs or panko crumbs (optional)

2 Tbsp butter, melted

Directions

- 1. Preheat the oven to 400°F.
- 2. Wash and dice your vegetables. Dense vegetables such as butternut squash and carrots should be cut into slightly smaller pieces to allow them to cook at the same rate as the other vegetables. If using onion, saute it first. Mushrooms can be halved or quartered. Feel free to use frozen or canned vegetables if convenient; frozen veg do not need to be thawed beforehand, though large chunks should be broken up.
- 3. Mix together the cream soups and seasonings in a bowl. Go easy on the salt, as the soups will already contain some. Contrary to what the directions on the can say, do NOT add any water, unless you want your casserole to be very soupy.
- 4. Add all your chopped vegetables to a casserole dish or deep cast iron skillet. Place the chicken on top of the vegetables, then evenly spread the seasoned cream soups over the top of everything. Cover with aluminum foil.
- 5. Mix the bread crumbs with the melted butter and set aside.
- 6. Baking time will depend on how thick you cut your chicken pieces. Bake for at least 30 minutes, then check the chicken and vegetables for doneness. Once the chicken is no longer pink in the center and the most dense veggies are tender, then remove the foil, top with the buttered crumbs, and bake uncovered for another 5 mins or until crumbs are golden.
- 7. Serve hot over rice or noodles.

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




June 25 - National Take Your Dog to Work Day

have sacrificed everything to work with each child as a precious gift, working hard to identify each child's strengths and areas of growth. This past 15 months has been especially difficult on teachers, and they have stepped up to the challenge.

Even with the fact that teachers are to be commended for what they do each and every day, we cannot ignore that what Kendi has written about concerning the inequities in our educational system are difficult realities. We all have heard news reports about the challenges families in some areas have had in accessing computer equipment and the internet. We have been confronted with the reality that the areas experiencing the most difficulty tend to be communities of color, communities with lower income. We have seen the news reports and I find myself asking, "what if this were my child?" We can no longer close our eyes to the realities. We must confront the racism and the inequities that we have allowed to create such realities.

Romans 12:5 has these words for us: In the same way, though there are many of us, we are one body in Christ, and individually we belong to each other.

I read the words of the CHALLENGE on All In Education's website and I began to wonder what would happen if we developed a partnership? How could we, as people who believe the words in Romans 12:5, work together to impact our educational system? How could we develop relationships with parents, teachers, and school administrators in a way that actually brings about transformation?

In my last blog I shared an invitation to discuss how we might create a Neighboring Movement in our ministry areas. Today I want to invite you into a discussion about how we might create a movement that benefits children and families.
