## Dear Beloved Members and Friends of FUMC Tucson,

Grace and peace to you in this sacred season of Lent.

As we journey through Lent, we are invited into a time of deep reflection, repentance, and renewal. Lent is more than just a season of preparation—it is a sacred pilgrimage of the heart, a time to draw closer to God by embracing spiritual disciplines that shape us into the likeness of Christ.



Richard Rohr once wrote, "The spiritual life does not remove us from the world but leads us deeper into it. The more we are transformed by the presence of God, the more we can bring His love and grace to the world around us." In the early church, Lent was a season of preparation for baptism and the renewal of faith. Even today, it is a time for us to pause, pray, and purify our hearts as we move toward the profound mystery of Holy Week and the joy of Easter. It is a season of fasting from distractions, feasting on God's Word, and renewing our commitment to follow Jesus with deeper faith.

## Lenten Opportunities for Spiritual Growth

I warmly invite you to join us on this Lenten spiritual journey in meaningful ways:

Weekly Reflection & Walk on the Labyrinth – Every Thursday at 10:00 AM at Rio Vista Natural Resource Park, we will gather to reflect on the Psalms and take a spiritual walk. This is a beautiful way to engage in quiet reflection and prayer. Whether you have a Lenten booklet or not, all are welcome!

Small Group Discussion: "What Are Your Biggest Questions About Spirituality?" – Led by St. Francis in the Foothills UMC, this thought-provoking series will take place every Tuesday during Lent at the Bruce Billings Building (formerly the CCC).

Holy Week Services – As we move toward the culmination of Lent, I encourage you to prepare your hearts for Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and ultimately, the glorious celebration of Easter morning.

Lent leads us to the cross, where we witness the depth of Jesus' love, and to the empty tomb, where we celebrate the victory of His resurrection. Without Good Friday, there would be no Easter Sunday. Without the journey of Lent, we might not fully grasp the beauty and hope of resurrection morning.

As we step deeper into this season, I encourage you to embrace the journey—whether through prayer, fasting, scripture reading, or acts of service—and allow God to renew and transform your spirit.

"Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God." (Colossians 3:16, ESV)

Below: The balcony room on the second floor is being transformed into the Korean Young Adults' room. More updates will be shared later.



Marjorie Task, a devoted choir member, passed away. A celebration of her life will be held at First Church on April 5th at 11 AM.



## at Redemptorist Renewal Center, Tucson

"The earth is the Lord's and the fullness thereof; the world, and they who dwell therein." Ps. 24:1. The environmental crisis demands a response from the faith community, because the problem is not just a scientific or political problem; it's a spiritual problem. Materialism dictates our value system; we're short-sighted about the use of the earth's resources. Local churches have often chosen denial or complacency rather than hope and engagement, even though the environment is often the number one concern of our young people. This retreat is a journey into the heart of our faith tradition and the scientific community as together we find ways to respond.



## Our Faculty Presenter

**The Rev. Molly Vetter** is a United Methodist pastor serving as Senior Pastor at Westwood UMC, Los Angeles, California. Molly grew up in Nebraska, where her grandfather started organic farming in 1953. Molly's family now runs the farm, while she continues to be involved as part of her commitment to caring for the earth. A recognized leader in the UMC and ecumenical community, Molly has been a delegate to General Conference (4 times); served on the General Board of Church and Society; and participated in the Faith and Order work of the National Council of Churches and the World Council of Churches. Molly recently completed the two-year Academy for Spiritual Formation. She lives with her husband Matthew Parker and their son Jonah.



#### Science Consultant

**Dr. Gary Paul Nabhan** is a globally renowned ethno-botanist at the University of Arizona in Tucson. An ecumenical Franciscan Brother, Gary combines his scientific interest with wide-ranging interests in cultural diversity, spiritual practice, and traditional indigenous knowledge. Considered a pioneer in the local food movement, Gary has authored more than twenty books, including Jesus for Farmers and Fishers: Justice for All Those Marginalized by our Food System, recommended reading for this retreat. Gary lives with his wife Laurie in Patagonia, Arizona, where he farms a diverse set of heirloom fruit and nut varieties from the Spanish Mission era and from his Middle Eastern heritage.

## **The Program**

We begin this immersion retreat on Earth Day (April 22, 2025) at Redemptorist Renewal Center nestled next to Sahuaro National Park (West). With worship and joy, we'll celebrate the earth and listen for her songs. With silence, prayer, and community we'll learn and grieve, find hope and courage for the Great Work of addressing environmental degradation. Besides the classroom setting, we'll engage in field trips where we can listen to those actively creating places of ecological refuge. Our final day (Friday, April 25) will include time for discernment regarding "next steps" for addressing this crisis.

## Animal & Environmental Holidays for March 2025

# March - Pet Poison Prevention Awareness Month

This month is to educate and raise awareness about the dangers of accidental pet poisoning and how to prevent your beloved pets from becoming affected. There are products and foods that we use that may be poisonous for our pets – such as certain plants, medicines, xylitol, aspartame, and chocolate.



#### March 9th - National American Paddlefish Day

Created in 2019 by the Shreveport Aquarium to raise awareness about this prehistoric fresh water fish. They can be found in the Mississippi and Missouri River tributaries and the Mobil Bay Drainage Basin. They are listed as vulnerable due to fishing, habitat loss, dams and reservoirs.



## March 14th - Int'l Day of Action for Rivers

This is a day that raises awareness about rivers and how they need help being protected from pollution and sewage. The 2025 theme is "Our Rivers, Our Future" which emphasizes the vital role rivers have in sustaining life on our planet and the need to protect them for future generations. Ways to celebrate include volunteering for river cleanups.



#### March 14th - Moth-er Day

This is a day that is dedicated to moths and people who collect them. There are about 160,000 different species of moths in the world with about 11,000 species in the USA. Most moths can only be seen at night. Moths use light sources (the moon) to navigate, and often artificial lights can cause confusion.



## March 18th - World Serval Day

The Wildheart Animal Sanctuary created this day in 2023 to raise awareness about the threats faced by Servals and Savannah cats. Servals are exotic medium-sized wild cats native to Africa. Savannah cats are the offspring of wild servals and domesticated cats. Servals are beautiful but do not make good pets.



## March 18th - Global Recycling Day

This year we celebrate the 8th annual Global Recycling Day. This day encourages people to reduce waste, recycle materials, and reuse/repurpose products. The goal of this day is to raise awareness of the important role that recycling plays in preserving our natural resources for our planet's future.



#### March 20th - World Rewilding Day

The Global Rewilding Alliance created World Rewilding Day in 2021. The goal of this day is to raise awareness of rewilding. Rewilding is the practice of allowing places in our environment to be reclaimed by nature so wildlife and ecosystems can thrive. This can help nature recover worldwide.



### March 20th - International Day of Happiness

Established by the United Nations General Assembly in 2012 to maintain that happiness and well-being are important to all people in the world. We can celebrate this day by spreading joy to others, smiling at people you meet, thinking about when you are the happiest and making every day a day of happiness.



#### March 22nd - Earth Hour

The First Earth Hour was organized by WWF in 2007. This annual global event encourages individuals, communities, and businesses to turn off all non-essential electric lights for one hour from 8:30 pm to 9:30 pm (local time) to help protect the planet. The theme for 2025 is "Create the Biggest Hour for Earth".



## March 23rd - National Puppy and Cuddly Kitten Day

This is a special day to share with our beloved pets by spoiling them with extra treats and cuddles. It is also a day to encourage people to adopt pets from shelters instead of buying them. Ways to celebrate include donating, volunteering, and fostering.
