I love singing in a choir, and shortly after I began my conducting journey, I had the opportunity to become the music director for a young adult service at Go-cheok Church in South Korea. I'll never forget the first time I conducted a church choir and praised God with them. I felt truly blessed to lead the choir in worship! Later, I came to the U.S. for my master's degree and served as an accompanist for services at Korea Saehan Church in Louisville, Kentucky, since my church didn't have a choir. Now, I'm incredibly grateful to be the music director at First United Methodist Church, where I get to work with such passionate choir members. I'm looking forward to creating beautiful music together with the voices God has given us!

Youngeun Kim, a native of South Korea, is a second-year doctoral student in choral conducting at the University of Arizona. As part of her role as a graduate teaching assistant, she is currently the assistant conductor of the University Community Chorus. Additionally, she serves as assistant conductor at Tucson Masterworks Chorale. Youngeun completed a Bachelor of Music in Vocal Performance from Ewha Woman's University in South Korea, where she also earned a Master of Music in Choral Conducting. Subsequently, she achieved a second master's degree in Choral Conducting at the University of Louisville.

Animal & Environmental Holidays for October 2024

October - National Pet Wellness Month

The American Veterinary Medical Association (AVMA) created this month in 2004. The goal of this month is to promote pet health and wellness to keep them healthy with a focus on preventative care to keep them healthy all year long.



October 4th - World Animal Day/World Animal Welfare Day

The first world animal day was held in Germany in 1925 by Heinrich Zimmermann. Today it is a worldwide mission to improve the welfare standards for animals around the world and to make the world a better place for all animals. The 2024 theme is "The world is their home too."



October 6th - Change a Light Day

Created by the state of Kentucky in 2005 to help the environment by switching from the traditional incandescent light bulbs to LEDs. Some features of LED bulbs include: they consume less energy, have a longer life expectancy, and are better for the environment compared to regular light bulbs.



October 7th - World Habitat Day

The United Nations established this day in 1985 with the goal that everyone has the basic right to have adequate shelter in our towns and cities. The 2024 theme is "Engaging youth to create a better urban future."



October 12th - International African Penguin Awareness Day

In 2010, the African Penguin was placed on the US Endangered Species lists as their populations have continued to decline. This special day is to raise awareness of the plight of these amazing flightless birds which includes climate change, oil spills, overfishing, and habitat destruction.



October 14th - International E-Waste Day

Created in 2018 by the Waste from Electronic (WEEE) Forum to raise awareness about electrical and electronic equipment waste and to encourage people to recycle. The 2024 theme is "Join the E-Waste Hunt – Retrieve, Recycle, and Revive!"



October 16th - World Food Day

Created by the United Nations General Assembly to celebrate the creation of the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO). The goal of this day is to raise awareness about people suffering from hunger in the world. The 2024 theme is "Right to foods for a better life and a better future."



October 16th - National Fossil Day

The 15th anniversary of National Fossil Day. It is a day to celebrate the scientific and educational principles of paleontology and learn about preserving fossils for future generations. Ways to celebrate this day include visiting your local museum, learning about fossils, and attending special events.



October 22nd - International Wombat Day

Created in 2005 by Chris Mabe to raise awareness about these amazing marsupials. There are three species of wombats native to Australia and all are protected. The Northern Hairy-Nosed and Southern Hairy Nosed Wombats are Endangered and the common wombat is of Least Concern.



October 25th - World Lemur Day

Let's celebrate and protect these amazing and endangered primates. There are 112 different species of lemur that are all native to Madagascar. They are endangered due to environmental issues, hunting, climate change, and the pet trade industry
