Animal & Environmental Holidays for December 2023

December 5 - Volunteer Day

Volunteers are wonderful humans with a helpful spirit. There are many ways and many places one might volunteer; their time or services. One could walk a shelter animal or help feed the homeless. Volunteers are always welcome and needed to help clean up after fellowship time.



December 10 - International Animal Rights Day

Created in 1998 by the animal rights group Uncaged. This day is also shared with Human Rights Day, because both animals and humans have the right to be treated with respect and without cruelty.



December 11 - International Mountain Day

Designated by the UN General Assembly in 2003 to raise awareness of the importance of sustainable mountain development. The 2023 theme: "Restoring Mountain Ecosystems".

Mountains are under threat from climate change, overexploitation, and pollution.



December 11 – Holiday Food Drive for Needy Animals

This day focuses on collecting animal food and other needed supplies that help support the animals that are in shelters. There is a collection box located in the Fellowship Hall for "Friends of PACC" to help support PACC and the community. The last day to donate is 12/17.



December 14 - January 5 - Christmas Bird Count Week

The National Audubon Society has conducted its Christmas bird counts since 1900. Tucson Valley Christmas Bird Count is celebrating its 52nd year. It's an international census of birds consisting of 17 countries participating in the counting. Volunteers count birds in their circle.



December 25 - Christmas

Christmas is one of the most important Christian holidays during the year. The true meaning of Christmas is the celebration of our Savior, Jesus Christ.
