Greetings in Jesus Christ, I came back to my regular ministry on Monday, Feb 13th. Thanks to your support and prayers, I was able to take some time off from my pastoral responsibilities for a month. Instead, I was able to focus on my Doctorate studies and family issues. I am so grateful for all of your love and care for me.

The more I minister, the more I realize that a pastor can grow in faith surrounded by the congregation which prays, supports, and loves.

When I came back to my regular duties, there were so many amazing things happening in the church. First, the Nomads came and contributed to renewing our church buildings for three weeks. This was the first time I witnessed their dedicated work as a pastor here at FUMC of Tucson. I am amazed by their endless efforts and joyful spirits for the work of God's kingdom.

They have made improvements to our church campus, which includes repainting the metal fences and stucco walls by the parking lot; stripping and resealing the narthex floor; re-installing the large banners outside; eliminating most of the gaps in our hallway and kitchen flooring; pouring concrete to repair a ramp; and many other projects, big and small.

Also, without Sam Haney, it wouldn't have been as successful as it was. He spent hours and hours getting the materials for the Nomads for the projects and coordinating their meals and snacks in order and in between. That is an almost full-time duty for the project.

While I was observing his dedication, I was also reminded of all the other laity in the church. The First United Methodist Church of Tucson wouldn't exist without all the laity: liturgists, ushers, Covenant Board members, Foundation Board members, Hospitality and Kitchen Fellowship team, SPRC (Staff Parish Relations Committee), Children and Family Ministry team, Music Ministry team including choir members, trustees, lay leader, lay speaker, lay minister, Praise Team members, Audiovisual Ministry team, Health and Mission Ministry team, Animal Ministry team, and many other dedicated laities. If I forgot to name them, please, let me know so I won't forget to include them next time.

There are no words to express how much I am grateful for and how many blessings I can count as a pastor of the FUMC of Tucson. The twentieth-century theologian Karl Barth stresses that the church is the true church only insofar as Jesus Christ is present and acting in and through its members. Another theologian, Paul Tillich, also addresses the church as a spiritual community on the appearance of the New Being in Jesus as the Christ.

While we journey together toward the celebration of Easter, we need to remember the theological definition of the church. The church wouldn't exist without the work of the Holy Spirit embodied by Jesus Christ through the church members.

- 3. **Respond** to what you have read. Form a prayer that expresses your response to the idea.
- 4. **Rest** in God's word.

Animal & Environmental Holidays for January 2023

March - Seagrass Awareness Month

In May 2022, the UN General Assembly proclaimed this day as World Seagrass Day to raise awareness that helps promote conservation and restoration. There are 26 species in U.S. waters. Sadly, many manatees have died off in Florida due to the decline of seagrasses.



March 13th - K-9 Veterans Day

Created in honor of the Army K9 Corps founded on March 13, 1942, by Joe White a Vietnam War Veteran. It is a day to honor and commemorate the service of our brave K-9's that have served and sacrificed throughout history in the military, law enforcement, service, and support dogs.



March 14th - Save a Spider Day

Spiders are important to our ecosystem. Spiders help eradicate many dangerous pests in your home or in the environment. Remember to help protect them – if you find one in your house – do a catch and release.



March 15th - International Day of Action Against Seal Slaughter

Every year there is a cruel and unnecessary seal hunt. They hunt and kill primarily baby harp seals for their fur. Adult seals are also targeted. There is a call to action to stop this inhumane act. Some ways to get involved include signing petitions to stop seal hunting and to boycott seal products; like fur, etc.



March 18th - Global Recycling Day

Created in 2018 to celebrate the 70th birthday of the Bureau of International Recycling (BIR). It is a day to help preserve the natural resources of our planet by recycling and reusing items to have resources for the future. A day for the world to come together and put the planet first.



March 18th - Save the Panther Day

Panthers are included in the Endangered Species List- and it is illegal to hunt or bother them. As of 2023, there are estimated to be about 120-230 adult panthers left. Florida's governor will officially proclaim this day and the state's efforts in saving their panthers.



March 20th - World Sparrow Day

Sparrows have adapted to life next to humans for thousands of years. Sadly, their population size is decreasing. Possible reasons are destruction of habitat, lack of food, and cellular tower outputs. This year's theme is "I LOVE Sparrows".



March 21st - International Day of Forests -

Created by the United Nations General Assembly in 2012, to celebrate and raise awareness of the importance and need for forests for the welfare of people, animals, and plants to thrive. These precious ecosystems need to be protected. The 2023 theme is "Forests and Health".



March 21st - National Renewable Energy Day

Every day people make an impact in the world. Sometimes it is good and sometimes for bad impact. The goal of this day is to bring awareness of the dangers of our overusing fossil fuels. There are natural alternatives such as hydroelectric power, solar/sunlight, wind, and rain.



March 23rd - International Bear Day

There are about 8 species of bears. Six species are considered threatened or vulnerable on the IUCN Red List. Humans put them in danger by encroaching, the illegal wildlife trade, and "medicinal" practices. In North America we have variations of brown and black bears.
