



#### UPDATE: Phase Two of AC Mission Project Announced: The Inn

The first part of this year's Annual Conference Mission Project is monetary donations to support the <u>Asylum Aid and Border Ministries Fund</u>. This fund provides financial support to our churches who are engaged in asylum and border mission work, helping people who come from all over the world to the United States, seeking asylum and safety from human predators.

We are delighted to share that <u>The Inn</u> has been selected to receive item donations. This ministry provides care for migrants passing through the U.S./Mexico border.

Director Gretchen Lopez shares that the following items are needed:

- Toddler & children's t-shirts (2T-16)
- Toddler & children's pants/shorts (2T-16)
- NEW Children's underwear (XS, S, M, L, XL)
- NEW Children's Socks
- Women's leggings or stretch pants (S, M)
- Women's t-shirts, long and short sleeves (S, M)
- NEW Women's underwear (Size 5 & 6)
- Women's Bras (sports bras S/M/L but not XL)
- NEW Women's socks
- Men's jeans/sweatpants (28-32" waist highest demand, but need all sizes 28-38")
- Men's t-shirts, long and short sleeves (S, M, L)
- NEW Men's underwear (S, M, L)
- Men's belts (S, M, L)
- NEW Men's socks
- Flip Flops (for showers)
- Diapers (Size 4, 5, 6, 7)
- Baby Wipes (individual packs)

# Animal & Environmental Holidays for April 2024

#### May is National Clean Air Month

Created in 1972 by the American Lung Association. This month encourages people to contribute to cleaner outside and inside air. Ways to help include carpooling, reducing dust at home by vacuuming, choosing pump sprays instead of aerosols, and having houseplants and trees.



#### May 8th - World Donkey Day

Created in 2017 to celebrate these hard-working animals, which are often used as a "beast of burden". Sadly, they are often abused and used in harsh conditions. Donkeys are known for being stubborn, but usually only refuse to move if they feel they are not safe or are in danger.



### May 10th-19th - National Public Gardens Week

Created in 2009 by the American Public Gardens Assoc. and Rain Bird to encourage people to visit local public gardens. Tucson's local gardens can provide education on environmental resources such as plants, water conservation, and beautiful green spaces.



### May 11h - Migratory Bird Day

In North America, about 75% of the birds migrate to some extent. Birds usually migrate for better food sources and better climate conditions. This year's theme is "Protect Insects, Protect Birds", which focuses on the importance of insects as a food source for migratory birds.



May 17th - National Endangered Species Day Celebrating the 19th Anniversary of the Endangered Species Day which celebrates learning about and taking action to help protect threatened and endangered species. According to the IUCN, there are more than 44,000 species of flora and fauna that are at risk of extinction.



#### May 18th - National River Cleanup Day

Starting in 1991 The "American Rivers" org. along with thousands of volunteers have cleaned up rivers across the USA. Rivers are an important source of water, but they also provide habitats for animals and plants. They need to be protected and cleaned up for future generations.

International Day for Biodiversity 2024

#### May 22nd - Int'l Day for Biological Diversity

Created by the UN to raise awareness and understanding of biodiversity issues. The 2024 theme is "Be Part of the Plan". The goal of this day is to halt and reverse the loss of biodiversity - to make sure that all creatures and ecosystems not only survive but will thrive.



#### May 25th - World Fish Migration Day

Migratory fish swim short or long distances to complete their life cycle, mate, and feed. The goal of this day is to ensure the survival of these species for future generations. This year's theme is "Free Flow" - to help safeguard rivers and restore swim ways for migratory fish.



#### May 28th Intersectional Environmentalist Day

Created in 2020 by Leah Thomas, a Los Angeles environmentalist. This day recognizes that environmental injustice does not affect all people equally. Intersectional Environmentalism advocates for the protection of both people and the planet.



#### May 29th - World Otter Day

This holiday was created in 2014 by the International Otter Survival Fund to raise awareness about these cute and playful mammals. There are 13 different species. All species of otters are at risk of survival due to habitat loss, road accidents, illegal trade for fur and as pets.
