
"Enlarging Cultural Elegance!"

Hello Neighbor,

Catalina United Methodist Church has been a place of worship, an icon and a celebratory location in Tucson for 100 years this year! Christened University Methodist Church on Easter Sunday, April 16, 1922, located at the northwest corner of University Blvd. (then 3rd St.) and Euclid Ave., that congregation grew into what is now Catalina United Methodist Church at its current location on East Speedway Blvd.

Many who have lived in Tucson for any length of time have attended an event or service at Catalina. Whether it was a Sunday church service, Christmas or Easter service, Bible Study, wedding, memorial service, choir concert, organ concert, community service project, youth group, summer camp, Vacation Bible School, Memorial Garden experience, or the Catalina Day School, the church has had connections throughout the valley for the past 100 years!

Catalina is known for having an impact on Tucson's religious, cultural, and social justice landscape over the years. In 1940 the University Methodist Church gave space to gather for the Tucson Boys Chorus, founded by Eduardo Caso a member of the church. Catalina sponsored the Sunday Evening Forum which featured nationally known speakers and performances from 1942 – 1984. Catalina's pastor Roland Brammeier founded Tucson Metropolitan Ministries in the early 1970's. Catalina United Methodist Church helped to start six other United Methodist Churches in Arizona. Catalina is a member of the Reconciling Ministry Network. Catalina has produced over 30 United Methodist pastors over the years; individuals who grew up in the church and/or folks who have come to be sponsored by the church. Catalina United Methodist Church has made a positive difference in the spiritual lives of thousands of people.

Catalina has a history of an exemplary Music Ministry with the Sanctuary Choir, Bell ringers, Catalina Brass, and the Cornerstone Contemporary Band. In the past, the Sanctuary choir has toured Europe and has sung at Carnegie Hall. The Organ festival, which occurs throughout the year, brings world renowned organists to perform concerts on the Quimby pipe organ.

SOUL KITCHEN

Magic Air Fryer Bagel Bites With Everything Bagel Seasoning

Ingredients

- 1 c all-purpose flour ½ tsp salt
- 2 tsp baking powder
- 1 c nonfat Greek yogurt
- 4 Tbsp (4 oz or half pkg) ¹/₃ less fat cream cheese, cut into 8 cubes
- 1 egg white, whippedEverything bagel seasoning or get creative!

Directions

- 1. In a bowl mix the flour, baking powder and salt until well combined.
- 2. Add the yogurt and mix until well combined.
- 3. Add a little flour to your counter or cutting board and knead the dough a few times until the dough is a little wet but not very sticky. (You can also add flour to your hands to mix it easier.)
- 4. Divide the dough into 8 equal parts. Flatten each dough ball into circles, then place ½ tablespoon cream cheese on each. Fold up the edges around the cream cheese and form a ball. Use a drop of water to seal the edges if necessary, so the cream cheese doesn't pop out.
- 5. Brush with egg white and sprinkle with everything bagel seasoning. You can also leave them plain or use another topping. (I want to try cinnamon sugar!)
- 6. Turn the air fryer to 320°F and set for 12 minutes. They will expand so don't place them right next to each other in the air fryer. You may need to do a couple of batches.
- 7. Wait a few minutes to enjoy them because they will be very hot inside!

These have so many possibilities! You can make them plain, or you could add something to the cream cheese to add flavor.

Notes from Tripp:

- Don't have an air fryer? You can also make these in a convection oven or a toaster oven with a convection setting.
- I have made these with canned biscuit dough (flattened with a rolling pin) and they turned out great.

Animal Holidays - A Week at a Glance

February 15 - World Hippo Day

The Hippo's full name is Hippopotamus (what a mouthful). This day was created to honor and educate others about the hippo's vulnerable status. Hippos are native to sub-Saharan Africa. They are mammals who are mostly herbivores. They are semi-aquatic creatures that can be found in rivers, lakes, and mangrove swamps.

February 19 - World Pangolin Day

2022 marks the eleventh annual celebration of World Pangolin Day. They are endangered. They are hunted and poached for their scales, and to be eaten. This day is to raise awareness about their struggles and encourage people to join together to save these creatures. They are the most trafficked animal.



February 20 - World Whale Day



Whales are found in our diverse ocean ecosystem. They can range in size from 98' (blue whale) and 6'7"- 8'10" inches (toothed dwarf sperm whale). This day was created on Maui in 1980, originally to honor humpback whales but now includes all whales. Another important note about this day is that its goal is also to raise awareness of mankind's disruption of this beautiful habitat: dumping waste and pollution, to name a few.

February 20-26 - National Justice for Animals Week

This week was created by the Animal Legal Defense Fund. Their goal was to educate the public about crimes that are perpetrated against animals. It is important to learn what is considered as animal cruelty and to hold people accountable. Each year a spokes animal is highlighted that can show where the law can help animals more. They end the week with that year's list of America's Top Animal Defenders.
